Introduction

The church is traditionally said to have been formed in 1662, but no records survive from this period. It was certainly established by 1674, when an annuity for the minister was bequeathed by Ruth Sparrow, and a church building is first recorded in 1707.

Records survive from the pastorate of the Revd Archibald Douglas (1796-1840). In 1800 the original meeting house in Broad Street was demolished, and a new one built on the site.

An unusual co-pastorship system operated at times at Broad Street, which resulted in three major secessions: in 1718 to form a Presbyterian church in Sun Lane, in 1845 to form Trinity Congregational Church (D/N 10), and in 1869 the Gordon-Legg controversy which gave rise to the relatively short-lived Augustine Church in Friar Street, Reading (which merged with Castle Street Congregational Church (D/N 9) in c.1886). There were daughter churches at Tilehurst, Tokers Green and Arborfield.

The Revd Archibald Douglas was instrumental in the formation, in 1797, of the Reading Evangelical Society, which promoted the growth of evangelical free churches in the Reading hinterland, and, about the same time, of the Berkshire Association of Independent Ministers and Churches (see D/N 25).

The church closed in 1984. The building was sold and converted into Waterstone's bookshop in 1995.
