The Wilson windmill collection

This collection, largely of photographic and postcard exterior views of windmills, mostly in Kent and Sussex, was donated to the Science Museum Library by Mrs Helen M. Wilson. Mrs Wilson (1914-1998?) was the niece of the last owner/operator of Union Mill, Cranbrook, John Russell. [It was Russell to whom Rex Wailes dedicated his book *The English Windmill* (1954).]

Union Mill had been in the hands of the Russell family from 1832 until 1958 when, on the death of John Russell, it was given in trust to Kent County Council. Mrs Wilson herself grew up at Union Mill and her mother, Gwendolen Russell, sister of John Russell, began the collection.

We are most grateful to Mr J S P Buckland for identifying many photos in this collection.

8 Union Mill, Cranbrook, Kent / The Russells - photographs

Union Mill was bought in 1832 by brothers George and John Russell, the latter being the great great grandfather of Helen M. Wilson (HMW). In 1840 Medhurst of Lewes erected four patent double sails and a new wind shaft and George Warren of Hawkhurst erected a fantail. Ebenezer, great grandfather of HMW, succeeded, followed by her great uncle Hugh, her grandfather Caleb [from 1902-18] and her uncle John.

The fantail and shutters had been removed in 1912 so John ran the mill with four common sails and no fantail. In 1920 he brought four common sails from Sarre mill and fitted one pair as spring sweeps and in 1922 fitted the other pair converting all to patent sweeps. The new fantail, made by William and Frank Warren of Hawkhurst, was fitted by John in 1921. In 1937 he made and fitted a new sail and in 1946 rebuilt an old one.

1950 saw the end of wind-working as one stock had decayed. In 1952 [with Mr Lewis as partner] an electric motor was installed. John Russell died in 1958 just three days after the Bremers began their repairs.
