According to the *Abstract of Returns of Charitable Donations 1786* and the *Charity Commissioners' Report 1838* there were four charities in the parish of Bonvilston. Little is known about the 'Unknown Charity' which amounted to the interest on £20. David John's Charity consisted of interest on only £10 bequeathed in 1776. The records listed below described as the Bonvilston Charities appear to relate, however, only to the Grace Aubrey Charity and Mrs. Lougher's Charity. The first consisted of a bequest made by will of Grace Aubrey in 1678 amounting to £100 from which £6 was to be allocated to the poor of the parish. Mrs. Lougher's Charity was a bequest 1732 of interest on £50 for the same purpose.

The Glamorgan Record Office also holds accounts of the Grace Aubrey and David John charities 1828-1849 and correspondence and other papers of the Bonvilston Charities 1895-1907 including the Charity Commission's Order for the Aubrey and Lougher Charities 1898 and a list of cottagers receiving charity 1898 among the records of the parish of Bonvilston (Glamorgan Record Office references P/29/46 and 47).
