## **CONTEXT**

**Administrative/Biographical history:** William Bassett of Miskin, Glamorgan, was second son of William Bassett of Broviskin, and fellow of All Souls College 1664. He served as sheriff of Glamorgan 1653, and is described in 1673 a 'Doctor of Civil Law'. The Miskin estate was inherited by his younger brother, Thomas Basset. Thomas's son and heir was William Bassett of Miskin (d. 1770), sheriff of Glamorgan in 1734. His son died in 1769 and the estate passed to his daughter, Cecil Bassett. Cecil married Stephen White a Bristol merchant, and the Miskin estate descended to their daughter Anne White, wife Francis Saunderson of Castle Saunderson.

## **CONTENT**

**Scope and content/abstract:** Survey book of William Bassett, doctor of laws, deceased, compiled [c. 1672]; rent roll, 1678, of lands mainly in the Vale of Glamorgan, parishes around Cardiff, and the manor of Penrhys; and survey book of lands in Miskin and in the manor of Penrhys, [c. 1750].
