Administrative/Biographical history: Sir Edward Stock Hill (1834-1902) was a partner in Charles Hill and Sons, Merchants and Shipowners, Bristol, Gloucestershire. He was M.P. for south Bristol 1886-1900; President of Chamber of Shipping of the U.K., 1881; President of Associated Chambers of Commerce, 1888-91, and was a Provincial Grand Master of Mark Freemasons for South Wales. He was knighted in 1892.
