Introduction

The detailed schedule of this large collection deposited by Messrs Longmore, formerly Sworder and Longmore, was commenced some years ago when an unclassified, serially-numbered system of listing was in operation. As a considerable proportion of the collection had been catalogued in some detail under this system, it was decided to retain the existing schedule rather than re-list when the remaining portion was dealt with under the classified system which is now used. The serially-numbered list and the classified list which follows it should accordingly be regarded as complementary to each other.

The material in this list is topographically arranged and consists primarily of title, manorial and estate documents, with a quantity of business and family papers. There are also a small proportion of papers accrued by Messrs Longmores or their partners in their various official capacities, an aspect of the collection which is discussed more fully in the introduction to the classified inventory of the rest of the documents.
