#### Introduction

The New Barnet Circuit was formed in 1875 to include the churches at High Barnet, New Barnet and Whetstone in Middlesex. Prior to this date this area had formed part of the London Kentish Town Circuit. Potters Bar was added in 1882 from the St Albans Circuit (see NM5). Services were discontinued at Whetstone in 1885. Discussions were held in 1908-9 concerning the possible re-opening of a church here but no further action was taken (see NM1B/2).

In 1929 the Barnet Circuit was instituted comprising the churches of High Barnet, East Barnet, New Barnet and Potters Bar. A site for a church was purchased at Brookman's Park in December 1937. Services were held in a private house pending the start of building operations. However the decision to build was deferred and the site was ploughed up during the war. It was eventually sold in 1954.

The church at Radlett was transferred to Barnet from the St Albans Circuit in June 1960 (see NM1E). Borehamwood also formed part of the Barnet Circuit from 1955 until the church was closed in 1977 (see NM1F). New Barnet (see NM1B) was closed in 1963 when the congregation amalgamated with the church at East Barnet to form the New Brookside Methodist church (see NM1C).

In 1979 Radlett became a partnership church served jointly by the Methodists and the United Reformed Church. Methodist services are also held at the United Reformed churches of St Andrews, Radlett, and Freston Gardens, Cockfosters.

The Barnet Circuit forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist Church.

## High Barnet Methodist Church

NM1A

Services were being held at Hadley Green at least from August 1770 when a parcel of land and buildings were conveyed to John Wesley by the Shewell family. A church was erected in 1838 almost certainly occupying the same site as the earlier premises. This building was sold to the Baptist Church in 1890 and is still used by them. A new site was purchased in High Street Barnet and the present church opened on 16 March 1892.

#### New Barnet Methodist Church, Station Road

Services were apparently first held in New Barnet in a shed at the corner of Lytton Road and Leicester Road. Premises were acquired in Station Road in 1860 and after various moves a new building on a corner site was erected between 1878-1880. This building was extended in 1892, and was used until its final closure in December 1962. The congregation amalgamated with the church at East Barnet to form the New Brookside Methodist Church (see NM1C).

Services were held in the Gospel Mission Hall, Jackson Road, East Barnet from 1893. This building continued to be used by the church until 1928. The site at Cat Hill was given to the church in 1914 by Mr William Jackson. An iron room, the gift of Miss Wyburn, was transferred to the site from Hadley Manor a year later. This building was opened on 4 December 1915 and modernised and extended in the 1920s. The Jackson Road Mission Hall was sold in 1928 and the proceeds used for the erection of a new church on the Cat Hill site. The foundation stone was laid on 24 July 1930 and the building opened in November of the same year. In 1962 this church was extensively rebuilt and amalgamated with the congregation from New Barnet (see NM1B) to form the New Brookside Methodist Church.

#### St John's Methodist Church, Baker Street, Potters Bar

Potters Bar now forms part of Hertfordshire but before 1965 was included in the Middlesex parish of South Mimms. By 1800 services were being held in premises at Barnet Side. A church at South Mimms appeared on the Luton Circuit Plan for 1813-14. However, from 1827 references can be found to "Mimms" in the records of the St Albans Circuit (ref NM5).

From 1880 a barn at Darkes Farm was used for services until a church built in the Hatfield Road was opened on 13 August 1883. Discussions were held in 1908 concerning the establishment of a further church at South Mimms but nothing appears to have come of this (see NM1B/2).

St John's, Baker Street, was erected in 1941 and the former Hatfield Road premises sold.

Potters Bar has formed part of the Barnet Circuit since 1882.

#### Radlett Methodist Church, Station Road

A group of Methodists were meeting at Radlett in the house of William Martin, a master blacksmith and local preacher by 1864. The congregation, however, seems to have dispersed by 1873. An iron chapel was finally erected on a freehold site in Station Road in 1902. The present church was opened on 5 January 1938. This building remains a Methodist trust property but since 1979 has been shared by the United Reformed Church under a partnership deed.

Radlett formed part of the St Albans Circuit until June 1960 (see NM5).

## Trinity Methodist Church, Croxdale Road, Boreham Wood NM1F

A group of Methodists were meeting in Boreham Wood by 1949 at first in private homes. As numbers grew several temporary venues for services were obtained including Laing and Sons recreational hut in Manor Way, a canteen in Catterick Way and the Infants School in Furzehill Road. The minister from High Barnet normally led the services.

A site for a new church in Croxdale Road was purchased from the London County Council and the foundation stone was laid on 14 May 1955. While building work was in progress after September 1955 services, and a Sunday School, run in cooperation with the Anglican church, were held in a temporary hut erected on the site. The new church, designed by Paul Mauger & Partners of Welwyn Garden City, was formally opened on 11 February 1956. Alterations and extensions planned in 1964 were never carried out.

The building was closed in 1976 and the premises sold the following year to the Jewish church.

#### HARPENDEN METHODIST CIRCUIT

### Introduction

Wesleyan Methodists were meeting in Harpenden at least from 1792 and in Markyate from 1808. The impetus for Methodist preaching in this area emanated from Luton and both Wesleyan and Primitive societies were connected with a circuit based on that town. Before Methodist Union the Luton circuits included societies as far removed as Flamstead, Redbourn, Kimpton, St Albans and Stevenage. In 1933 a new circuit centred on Hitchin was formed (see NM4) and the resulting much reduced Luton Circuit included the Hertfordshire chapels at Harpenden (High Street and Southdown Road), Kinsbourne Green, Batford, The Folly (Wheathampstead), Kimpton, Hexton, Lilley, Cockernhoe, Bendish, Markyate, Gaddesden Row, Flamstead, Trowley Botton, Redbourn and St Albans. A completely new circuit based on Harpenden was formed in 1942 to include the following: High Street and Southdown Road, Harpenden, Kinsbourne Green, Batford, The Folly (Wheathampstead), Kimpton, Markyate, Gaddesden Row, Flamstead, Trowley Bottom and Studham (Bedfordshire). The two societies at Flamstead and Trowley Bottom amalgamated in 1958 and a new church was opened at Trowley Hill in 1960 (see NM2G and NM2K). A second church at Wheathampstead known as The Hill was associated with the St Albans circuit from 1838 until its closure in 1939. What records survive of this church are listed under that circuit (see NM5I).

The Bedfordshire Record Office at County Hall, Bedford holds records of the Luton Methodist Circuit many of which relate to individual churches in Hertfordshire.

The Harpenden Circuit now forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist Church.

#### Kinsbourne Green Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

In May 1820 the house of Matthew Luck at Kinsbourne Green was registered as a place of worship for Methodists. Eight years later it appeared on the Luton Circuit plan. Not until 1856 was a small plot of land acquired and the first chapel built. Regular services were held until the 1890s when under increasing difficulties the church had to close for a year. However a new hall was built in 1931 and extended twenty years later when the original church was demolished.

## Harpenden High Street Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

Methodists were meeting in Harpenden at least from 1792 when the house of Thomas Robinson was registered for worship. This house, it is believed, formed one of a row of small cottages later known as Chapel Row on West Common, Harpenden. It was connected with the Luton Circuit from 1808 and was used for worship until the first chapel was built in Leyton Road in 1839. Chapel Row was demolished about 1902. This first chapel soon became too small and no other site being available land adjoining was purchased. A larger chapel completely replacing the old one was opened in 1886. A better organ was installed and stained glass windows added during the 1890s.

In 1922 the chapel trustees purchased the White House and its land in the High Street, Harpenden. The house was demolished but not until 1929 was work begun on the new chapel after innumerable fund raising efforts. This building, to a design by Allan Brace, was opened in 1930. The Leyton Road chapel was sold in 1935 after being used for a short period as a cinema [see NM2B/4/5].

The separate Harpenden Circuit was formed in 1942 and the High Street Church became its leading society with a Superintendent Minister. The work at High Street greatly expanded and the building underwent various internal alterations as a result, the Sunday School accommodation becoming particularly cramped. After further long and determined fund raising activities a separate building, erected on land at the rear of the church, was opened in 1975 solely for Sunday School and Youth work.

#### Southdown Methodist Church, Harpenden (Primitive)

Primitive Methodists from Luton were conducting open-air services in the Bowling Alley area of Harpenden, now known as Southdown, by the mid 1800s. They gradually confined themselves to one small cottage in Grove Road which was used as a Mission Hall until the first chapel was opened in 1865 on a site in Wheathampstead Road (later Southdown Road). A small room was added to the back of the chapel in 1888 for use as a Sunday School. Major alterations to the chapel were undertaken in 1898-1899 and a new school hall was built on the opposite side of the road on land leased from Charles Bennet Lawes. chapel was registered for marriages in 1905. Much needed income was obtained during the First World War from the army who used the Sunday School hall as barracks. The freehold of the land on which the Sunday School was built was purchased from the Lawes family in 1909 and further adjoining plots were obtained during the 1930s. A new Primary Department was built in 1954. Various alterations were made to the chapel building in 1959 but by the 1960s it was clear that an extensive modernisation programme was required. On 9 May 1970 the completely refurbished building was re-dedicated and ten years later new church halls were opened.

### Batford Methodist Church, Harpenden (Wesleyan)

Open air services were being held by 1884 at the west end of Bowers Heath Lane, retreating in the winter months to the home of Mr and Mrs Josiah Smart of Cold Harbour. A Sunday School was also held nearby at the cottage of Mr Robert Drury. The meetings proved so successful that this accommodation soon became inadequate. A piece of ground was purchased next to Mr Drury's cottage and a corrugated iron room was erected shortly afterwards. By 1900 it was obvious that this building was too small and a piece of land was purchased on the Batford Mill estate [Lower Luton Road] where housing development was scheduled. The new chapel, to designs by Messrs Anscombe and Franklin, was opened on 25 January 1905. The old building was sold for £25. An extension at the back of the Chapel was opened in 1922 for use as a School Hall. During the Second World War the building was used as a canteen for H M Forces but was very badly damaged by an incendiary bomb in May 1941. Further extensions adding substantially to the Chapel's accommodation were opened in March 1952.

### The Folly Methodist Church, Wheathampstead (Wesleyan)

Wheathampstead was listed on the Luton Circuit Plan of 1813-14 but very little is known of the activities in the area after this date. A chapel was built in 1887. Extensive alterations were made to the building in 1928 with the addition of a vestry and school room. A larger school hall was opened in 1938.

#### Kimpton Methodist Chapel (Wesleyan)

Methodists have been meeting in Kimpton since 1841 probably with the help of visiting preachers from Luton. A small chapel was opened in 1845 which was completely rebuilt in 1870. The cottages adjoining the chapel also belonged to the trustees. In 1892 the tenants were given notice to quit and plans were put in hand to convert the cottages into Sunday School accommodation. Extensive alterations were made in 1907 with the addition of a new school room, a vestry and new seating for the chapel. Electric lighting was installed in 1930. Special services were held in 1941 to commemorate 100 years of Methodism in Kimpton and again in 1970 one hundred years after the erection of the second chapel which is still in use.

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#### Flamstead Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

Methodists were meeting in Flamstead by 1836 as the place appeared on a Luton Circuit plan of that year. A large room was certified for worship in December 1841 and a chapel was in use by 1846. By the 1920s the society was experiencing great difficulties with the structure of the building and major repairs were put in hand. Electric light was installed in 1934. At the end of the Second World War it was clear that the building needed radical alteration. The Sunday School was particularly short of accommodation and as a temporary measure two classrooms were partitioned off under the gallery inside the church. The former Primitive chapel at Trowley Bottom (see NM2K) amalgamated with the Flamstead society of 1958. A new church on a completely new site at Trowley Hill was opened on 21 May 1960.

#### Markyate Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

Markyate was listed on the Luton circuit plan as early as 1808 and a chapel certainly existed here by 1846. A new chapel was opened in 1859 on adjoining land and the old building continued to be used as a Sunday School. Correspondence covering the period 1845-1863 concerning the enfranchisement of the chapel property is held in the Record Office under reference 81124 - 81133. A special fund was started in 1909, the chapel jubilee year, for the complete renovation of the exterior of the building. The chapel was licensed for marriages in 1919. By the 1930s the existing school room was proving inadequate but plans for development were shelved until after the Second World War. Then as funds were still in rather short supply the church gallery was converted into an extra school room as a temporary measure. Extensions to the rear of the chapel were opened on 2 September 1967.

A Primitive Methodist society also flourished in Markyate for a time - a chapel built in 1868 was closed and sold in 1907.

#### Studham Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

Services were being held in Studham from around 1825 sometimes in members' homes or very often in the open air. In 1859 Mr George Barnard offered a building formerly used as a workshop if money could be found to provide pews and a pulpit. A Sunday School was started and very soon the little chapel was no longer large enough. Mr Barnard stepped in again and offered a piece of his own freehold land on which to build a chapel. The new building was opened for worship on 25 June 1861 built entirely by voluntary help. The land on which the chapel now stood was purchased from Mr George Barnard in 1898. All debts were cleared by 1906 and a small extension was added two years later. In October 1925 two stained glass windows were unveiled to the memory of Mr George Barnard (who died December 1913) and his Mr John Barnard (died April 1923). Work was begun on a completely new chapel and Sunday School in 1965 to a design by H W Shaw of Dunstable.

#### Introduction

A preaching place at "Hempstead" appeared on the Luton Wesleyan circuit plan as early as 1813/14. A chapel existed in Redbourn Street, Hemel Hempstead in 1836 (see microfilm of baptism register 1836-7, PC26/1). At this date Hemel Hempstead formed part of the St Albans Circuit (see NM5). A separate Wesleyan Circuit based on Hemel Hempstead was formed in 1886 out of the St Albans Circuit to include the chapels at Hemel Hempstead, Nash Mills, Two Waters, Cowper Road Berkhamsted, Kings Langley and Abbots Langley. These chapels, however, remained independent only until 1904 when they became part of the larger Watford and Rickmansworth Circuit (see NM7). A chapel at Cupid Green was opened in 1940 (see NM7H). The rapid growth of Hemel Hempstead New Town necessitated the building of new churches: Wesley opened in 1956 (see NM3F) and Bourne opened in 1959 to replace the older church at Boxmoor (see NM3H). The former Wesleyan chapel at Cowper Road, Berkhamsted closed in 1956 (see NM3C) and Cupid Green in 1955.

A new Hemel Hempstead and Berkhamsted Circuit was formed in 1957 to include the chapels at Hemel Hempstead (at this date Marlowes and Wesley), Two Waters, Boxmoor and Nash Mills from the Watford Circuit, together with the former Primitive chapels at Berkhamsted, Ley Hill and Tring from the Chesham Circuit. Kings Langley and Abbots Langley formerly part of the older Hemel Hempstead Circuit remained in the Watford Circuit and documents relating to these two churches can be found listed under NM7. The church at Cupid Green became part of the Hemel Hempstead Circuit in 1961 when it was renovated and once more opened for worship. However, the records held by the Record Office have been kept together and are listed under the Watford Circuit whose church it originally had been (see NM7H).

The Hemel Hempstead and Berkhamsted Circuit now forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist Church.

A Wesleyan chapel at Two Waters had been acquired by the St Albans Circuit in 1846 (see NM5). It was rebuilt in 1867 and permission given to the trustees by the newly formed Hemel Hempstead Circuit to purchase additional land in 1887. The chapel was enlarged in 1889 by the addition of a vestry. This building soon became too small for the needs of the congregation and after prolonged fund raising activities a new church erected on adjacent land was opened on 5 February 1908. The old church continued to be used as a Sunday School until 1930 when it was declared to be unsafe. A new Sunday School hall was opened on 31 October 1931.

A Wesleyan chapel in Queen Street (now known as Queensway), Hemel Hempstead had been erected before 1868. In 1885 a plot of land was purchased in Marlowes and a new chapel opened on this site in November 1890. The former Queen Street premises were sold for £200. A centenary history of the Marlowes Church 1890-1990 compiled by Harry Kingham is available in the Record Office Search Room.

A society of Wesleyan Methodists were meeting in Berkhamsted as early as 1837. About 1840 they purchased Egerton House and met there together with a newly formed Temperance Society until 1846. In 1848, land was bought in Highfield Road for the erection of a new chapel but was used only for a short period as in 1856 it was sold to the Strict Baptists. Services were then held in rented rooms and it was not until October 1886 that an iron chapel moved from Hemel Hempstead was opened in Cowper Road. This building was later enlarged by the addition of a school and vestry. It was finally closed in 1956 and the congregation amalgamated with those attending Berkhamsted High Street [see NM3E]

Primitive Methodists first met in a rented room in Castle Street, Berkhamsted. They moved to a new church building in the High Street in 1867 which had to be enlarged thirty years later. The congregation from the former Wesleyan chapel in Cowper Road joined High Street in 1956 (see NM3C). This church was finally closed in 1976 and a new building in Shrublands Road, Berkhamsted was occupied jointly with the Anglicans to be known as All Saints, Berkhamsted. The former Methodist church was to be sold for conversion to offices.

A church had existed near Belswain's Lane, Nash Mills since 1839. An adjoining cottage was converted into a school and vestry in 1901. By the 1930's this building was too small for the needs of the Sunday School. Four adjoining cottages and land were purchased from John Dickinson and Co. Ltd. in 1939 and a new church hall designed by Smee and Houchin was erected shortly after the Second World War. All of this property was conveyed to the Hemel Hempstead Development Corporation in 1953 in exchange for a new site in the recently developed Barnacres Road. A new church on this site was opened on 8 January 1955 and a new church hall on 26 February 1972.

### Bourne Methodist Church, Hemel Hempstead

Hertfordshire Trade Directories record that a Wesleyan chapel existed in Cowper Road, Boxmoor as early as 1855. A new chapel was erected in 1943. However, with the growth of Hemel Hempstead New Town it was felt that a church was needed in a more central position. Consequently this church was sold in 1959 and the proceeds devoted to a new development in Northridge Way, Hemel Hempstead to be known as the Bourne Methodist Church.

### Introduction

### Hitchin Primitive Methodist Circuit

The Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire Primitive Methodist Mission was formed in 1916 by the amalgamation of the Letchworth and Hitchin Stations and the Biggleswade Branch. It included Biggleswade, Arlesey St John [see NM4N], Shillington, Meppershall and Brook Street Stotfold [see NM4S], Bedfordshire and Hitchin Nightingale Road [see NM4B], Letchworth Broadway [see NM4P] and Benington [see NM4E], Hertfordshire. Primitive societies at Baldock, Ashwell and Lidlington had been associated with the Hitchin Station prior to 1916. The Lidlington chapel originally established in 1863 was closed in 1906. The Ashwell chapel was closed in 1903 and Baldock in 1916.

The small society forming at Knebworth was included on the Primitive preaching plan as well as the Wesleyan plan from 1930 [see NM8A].

For information as to the later history of these churches see the notes relating to the Hitchin Wesleyan Methodist Circuit below.

### Hitchin Wesleyan Methodist Circuit

Wesleyan societies were established at Stevenage, Hinxworth, Baldock, Ashwell, Weston and Hitchin before 1800 and were associated with the St Neots Circuit. On the formation of the Biggleswade Circuit in 1810 these churches were transferred. By 1838 this circuit, now renamed Biggleswade and Hitchin Circuit included the Hertfordshire societies at Hitchin, Baldock, Weston, Stevenage, Ashwell, Hinxworth, Newnham, Norton, Pirton, Walkern, Ickleford, Royston, Graveley and Codicote.

A Wesleyan Methodist circuit centred on Hitchin was first formed in 1842 and included the churches at Brand Street Hitchin, Stevenage, Weston, Walkern, Pirton, Ickleford and Codicote, Hertfordshire and Christchurch Arlesey, Bedfordshire. The society at Codicote appears to have died out shortly after 1845.

The chapels at Baldock, Ashwell, Hinxworth, Newnham and Norton remained with the Biggleswade circuit. Graveley appears to have trnasferred to the St Neots Circuit. A small amount of material from the chapels at Ashwell and Hinxworth has been deposited in the Record Office [see NM11B and NM11C]. The records of the St Neots and Biggleswade circuits are held at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP and contain considerable information concerning individual societies. The chapel at Royston later became connected with the Cambridge circuit, the records of which are now deposited at the Cambridgeshire Record Office, Shire Hall, Cambridge CB3 0AP.

During the period 1854 - 1864 the Hitchin Circuit churches listed above were associated with the Luton Circuit. Records of this circuit are also held at the Bedfordshire Record Office.

A completely separate Hitchin Circuit with its own ministers was again instituted in 1864. The societies at Offley and Pegsdon were transferred to it from the Luton Circuit and in 1891 Graveley from the Biggleswade Circuit. Knebworth was also included on the Hitchin Wesleyan Circuit plan from 1930 [see NM8A].

### Letchworth Wesleyan Methodist Circuit

A separate circuit centred on Letchworth was formed in 1918 to include the two societies at Central and Norton Mission.

### Methodist Union 1933

New circuits were formed as follows:-

LETCHWORTH to include Letchworth Central, Broadway and Norton Mission, and Weston, Hertfordshire together with Stotfold Brook Street, Bedfordshire.

HITCHIN to include Brand Street and Nightingale Road Hitchin, Stevenage, Walkern, Pirton, Ickleford, Pegsdon, Offley, Graveley, Benington and Knebworth, Hertfordshire and Christchurch and St John Arlesey, Bedfordshire.

The former Wesleyan chapels at Baldock, Ashwell, Hinxworth and Stotfold High Street remained part of the Biggleswade Circuit which was also to include the Primitive society at Meppershall formerly part of the Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire Primitive Methodist Mission. A further church at Shillington, Bedfordshire also part of the Primitive Methodist Mission was transferred to the Luton Circuit.

The church at Broadway, Letchworth was closed in 1937 [see NM4P] and the members amalgamated with the Central Church [see NM4Q]. Knebworth formed part of the Hitchin Circuit until 1946 when it was transferred to the newly formed Stevenage and Knebworth Methodist Mission [see NM8A]. The church at Walsworth was added in 1954 [see NM4L]. The two formerly separate congregations at Arlesey, Christchurch and St John were amalgamated in 1961 [see NM4D]. The church at Graveley closed the same year [see NM4F] and at Pegsdon in 1970 [see NM4I]. The Methodist churches at Brand Street and Nightingale Road, Hitchin and the Congregational church at Queen Street amalgamated in 1969 to form the new shared church of Christchurch, Hitchin [see NM4A, B and C].

The modern Hitchin and Letchworth Circuit was formed in 1970 to consist of the churches at Christchurch Hitchin, Benington, Offley, Weston, Walsworth, Stotfold Brook Street, Central and North Avenue Letchworth, Arlesey, Walkern, and Pirton together

Wesleyan Methodists had met in Hitchin since before 1800 probably in members' homes. (see NM4A/1)

A plot of land in Brand Street (formerly known as Pound Lane) Hitchin together with some dilapidated maltings was purchased in 1830. The buildings were converted into a chapel which was used until 1834 when a new church was erected. Much of the cost of rebuilding was provided by Mr Thomas Ward, a Hitchin tanner who also gave a manse and a burial ground on the other side of the street

In 1870 the church was enlarged and partially rebuilt. It was closed in 1969 on the amalgamation of the Brand Street and Nightingale Road Methodist churches with the Queen Street Congregational Church to form the new Christchurch Hitchin (see NM4C)

### Nightingale Road Methodist Church, Hitchin (Primitive) NM4B

A Primitive Methodist society was formed in Hitchin in 1898, meetings first being held in the homes of members. The church in Nightingale Road was erected in 1900 on land purchased from Hitchin Gas Company and was further extended in 1921. In 1922 the church was licensed for the solemnisation of marriages and in the following year a house for the minister was erected at the back of the building.

The premises were purchased by the neighbouring Roman Catholic Church in 1969 on the amalgamation of the Brand Street and Nightingale Road Methodist congregations with the Queen Street Congregational Church (see NM4C).

### Christchurch, Arlesey (Wesleyan)

### St Faith, Walsworth

The development of this area of the town of Hitchin began in earnest after the second world war. In 1950 the Free Church Council started a Sunday School in a hut owned by the Tenants Association. ### Letchworth Central Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

A public meeting was held at the Food Reform Restaurant, Letchworth on 14 September 1909 and inaugural services at the Pixmore Institute in October of the same year. A cottage at Birds Hill leased for use as a "Wesley Institute" was officially opened by Mrs Ebenezer Howard on 7 March 1910. Sunday services continued to be held in the Pixmore Institute until the church in Norton Way was opened in September 1914. Extensions to the Sunday Schools were completed in 1955.

On the closure of the former Primitive chapel at Broadway in 1937 [see NM4P] the members amalgamated with the society at Central. The organ from the Broadway premises was transferred to Central at this time.

#### Letchworth North Avenue (Wesleyan)

On 26 April 1803 the Methodists certified the house of Thomas Street as a place of worship in Norton. This society became associated with the Biggleswade circuit. Records of this Circuit are held at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP where further references to the society at Norton may be found. Some early baptisms are recorded in the Hitchin Circuit baptism register NM4/52.

This early society may well have died out before the end of the nineteenth century. The name of Norton is next associated with the Methodist movement shortly before 1909 in the early years of the Garden City. The Norton Mission was begun at this period apparently under the auspices of the Letchworth Free Church to bring Methodist teaching to the growing new town of Letchworth. There appears to have been some difference of opinion with the Free Church as they refused to supply pulpits and in 1910 withdrew from any further responsibility for the Mission. Central Wesleyan Church then agreed to supply preachers provided the Norton members take full responsibility for any building work they may undertake [see NM4Q]. A small site at the junction of Cashio Lane and Norton Way was purchased from the Central church in 1912 and a wooden building erected. A new mission hall was opened in North Avenue in October 1914 and the church soon became known as North Avenue. This building was extended in 1924. present church was completed in 1934 as a memorial to the parents of Gipsy Smith. During the Second World War the hall was leased to Hertfordshire County Council for use as a day school.

#### Brook Street Methodist Church, Stotfold (Primitive)

A small group of Primitive Methodists had first met in Stotfold as early as 1845. Their first chapel was erected in Chapel Yard in 1848. The new chapel in Brook Street was built in 1869 and a Sunday School in 1909. This building was closed for public worship in May 1973 and the members amalgamated with the former Wesleyan church in High Street Stotfold. The organ from Brook Street was transferred to Arlesey and the chapel demolished for housing development.

During the early period of its existence it appears that this chapel was associated with Biggleswade Methodist circuit. Further records relating to this chapel may be available at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP where Biggleswade circuit records are held (see DDE91 and 94).

#### Stotfold High Street Methodist Church (Wesleyan)

In 1786 a building in the tenure of William Bennet and owned by William Bristow was licensed for the use of the Wesleyan Methodists in Stotfold. The first chapel was built in 1824 and shortly afterwards enlarged with the addition of a gallery. The present chapel in the High Street was built in 1869 and redesigned inside in 1969. Further alterations were made in 1983. The congregation from the former Primitive Methodist church at Brook Street, Stotfold amalgamated with High Street in 1973. The church in Brook Street was demolished (see NM4S).

Until 1970 this church formed part of the Biggleswade Methodist Circuit. Further records may be available at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP where Biggleswade circuit records are held (see DDE91 and 94).

The first chapel to be built in Park Street, Baldock was financed by Miss Harvey of Hinxworth at the end of the eighteenth century. It was extensively repaired in 1831 and now exists as two cottages. The present church in Whitehorse Street was erected in 1853 and a school room added in 1864. It was renovated for the centenary in 1953 and extensively remodelled in 1983.

### Introduction

A St Albans Wesleyan Circuit was first formed in 1824 and included the chapels at Watford, St Albans, Bovingdon, Sarratt, Flaunden and Rickmansworth. By 1870 the circuit had grown to include St Albans, Watford, Hemel Hempstead, Redbourn, Nash Mills, Two Waters, Shenley, Wheathampstead, Bovingdon, Sleaps Hyde, Abbots Langley, Kings Langley, Hatfield and Potters Bar.

A separate Watford circuit was created in 1872 (see NM7), and the chapels at Hemel Hempstead, Nash Mills, Two Waters, Berkhamsted, Kings Langley and Abbots Langley were formed into the Hemel Hempstead circuit in 1886 (see NM3). Potters Bar was transferred to the Barnet circuit in 1882 (see NM1 and NM1D). Therefore in 1886 the St Albans circuit consisted of only St Albans, Redbourn, Shenley, Wheathampstead, Hatfield and Sleaps Hyde. A chapel in Hatfield Road, St Albans was established in 1898 and a former Primitive Methodist chapel in Boundary Road, St Albans was transferred to the St Albans Circuit from the Luton Circuit in 1934 (see NM5B). New chapels were also erected in Hatfield, at Birchwood Avenue in 1938 and Oxlease in 1961 (see NM5E and 5F). The chapel at Wheathampstead was closed in 1939 (see NM5I).

The Methodist societies at Welwyn Garden City and Warren Way, Digswell also formed part of this Circuit for a short period (see NM8).

The St Albans Circuit now forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist church.

#### Primitive Methodists

A Primitive Methodist chapel existed in Sopwell Lane, St Albans by 1868 and at this date the chapel formed part of the Watford Primitive Circuit (see NM7/1). This chapel was sold in November 1875 when the society was offered the use of the former Independent chapel in Dagnall Street, St Albans (Ref. Urwick p. 206).

In 1877 the Primitive societies at St Albans and Redbourn split away from the Watford Circuit to become known as the St Albans Mission. The chapel at Redbourn transferred to the Luton Circuit in1887.

### Boundary Road Methodist Church, St Albans (Primitive)

A Primitive Methodist congregation had formed in St Albans by 1907 as part of the Luton Circuit. ### Sleapshyde Methodist Church

A society had been established here by 1839 and a chapel erected very shortly afterwards. It was enlarged in 1870 and a further room erected in 1904. A site for a new chapel at the junction of Sleaps Hyde Lane and Station Road was given to the church by Mr Ernest Stevens in 1936. However, throughout the Second World War the Society found it increasingly difficult to raise funds for this scheme. The site was eventually sold in 1953 and the money used to renovate and enlarge the existing building on to recently acquired adjacent land.

## The Broadway Methodist Church, Hatfield

A Methodist congregation had formed in Hatfield by the 1830's. For nearly forty years the only building available to them for worship was the stable of a public house. Lord Salisbury at first refused to offer land for a chapel and great difficulties were encountered in their efforts to obtain a site for purchase. The foundation stone on the Broadway site was laid on 29 May 1889 and the chapel opened the following October. The Broadway premises were sold in 1938 and the congregation transferred to the new chapel on the Birchwood Estate, Hatfield (see NM5E)

#### North Common Methodist Church Redbourn

A place for Methodist worship was first registered in Redbourn in August 1798 consisting of the dwelling house of Sarah Law. The first Wesleyan chapel here was opened on 20 October 1836 and registered in March 1837. This building remains today in industrial use. A new church with a schoolroom underneath was erected in 1876 on a site thirty yards away from the old church. This building was further enlarged in 1882 and is still used for Methodist worship today.

Primitive Methodists also worshipped in Redbourn at a chapel at East Common. In 1868 this society formed part of the Watford Primitive Methodist Church (see NM7/1). However East Common, Redbourn and the primitive chapel in St Albans were formed into a separate circuit in 1877 (see NM5) and further transferred, this time to the Luton Circuit in 1887. At Methodist Union in 1932 it was proposed that the two chapels in Redbourn should unite but members did not agree and amalgamation did not occur until 1939. During the Second World War the East Common church was let to industrial users. However in 1946 it was sold to the Open Brethen and once again used for worship. It was later demolished and a house now stands on the site.

The Methodist Chapel in Shenley was purchased in 1839 for £155. The building was originally the parish workhouse. It was renovated and extended in 1888-9 and in 1949 remodelled externally to plans prepared by the architects Mauger and May. The building was registered in 1956 for the solemnization of marriages.

As well as the church the Shenley trust also owned four cottages: nos. 90, 92 and 94 London Road, Shenley and Chapel Cottage to the rear of the church building. No.90 London Road was sold in 1969 and the remainder in 1977.

## The Hill Methodist Church, Wheathampstead

This church at The Hill, Wheathampstead was acquired by the St Albans Circuit in 1838. Difficulties were experienced in its early years through its situation on the top of a steep hill. The membership steadily declined after the foundation of a church at the Folly, Wheathampstead by the Luton Circuit in 1887. The premises were eventually sold in 1939 and remain standing today in industrial use. The Folly chapel continued in use and now forms part of the Harpenden Circuit (see NM2).

### Hatfield Road, Methodist Church, St Albans

An iron chapel was erected in Hatfield Road, St Albans in 1898. Only four years later the accommodation afforded by this iron building was considered inadequate for the membership. A fund was started and a new building, erected on a different site, was opened in 1905. This church was enlarged in 1910 and underwent considerable renovation and rebuilding in 1928.

#### Introduction

John Wesley notes in his Journal of 29 November 1790 that he preached in Stevenage at "Mrs Parker's". The first chapel was built shortly afterwards (see NM6A). By 1793 the society at Stevenage was attached to the St Neots Circuit. In 1810 on the formation of the Biggleswade Circuit Stevenage was transferred and remained part of that circuit until 1842. Surviving records of these two circuits are now held at the Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford, MK42 9AP.

Stevenage changed circuits once more, this time in 1842, to the newly constituted Hitchin Circuit. The society remained part of this circuit for more than 100 years (see NM4).

The growth of the New Town of Stevenage during the 1940s caused concern for the provision of Methodist teaching in the area. As early as 1946 a scheme was outlined for the formation of a Stevenage Mission separate from the Hitchin Circuit to include the Stevenage and Knebworth societies. The Mission was also to include the societies at Oaklands (Welwyn), Digswell and Burnham Green and from June 1960 Welwyn Garden City.

In 1969 a separate circuit centred on Welwyn Garden City was formed to include the churches at Welwyn Garden City, Knebworth, Oaklands and Digswell (see NM8). Records of the Knebworth and Oaklands societies are listed under that circuit (see NM8A and NM8B).

The Stevenage Methodist Team Ministry as it was renamed in 1969 comprised the churches of Stevenage Old Town (see NM6A), St Paul Broadwater, St John Chells [closed June 1985] and Pin Green Free Church.

In September 1993 the Stevenage Ministry and the Hitchin and Letchworth Circuit were combined to form a new North Hertfordshire Circuit. The records of the North Hertfordshire Circuit are listed separately (see NM12), but the records of the chapels of the old Stevenage Methodist Circuit after September 1993 will continue to be listed under NM6A-C.

The first chapel erected in Stevenage was built in the 1790's. It was financed by a lady called Miss Harvey who was also responsible for the Methodist chapels at Hinxworth and Baldock. This building was used until 1876 when it was sold to Mr. Shelford of Stevenage. It later became the Electricity show-rooms and is now a branch library. The new chapel at the south end of the High Street was opened on 23 November 1876. It has been altered and enlarged at various dates since that time.

#### St John's Methodist Church, Chells, Stevenage

The Reverend J C Bamber, minister of St Paul's Broadwater held his first meeting in a school hall in the Chells area of Stevenage in October 1960. Later that year he moved into a recently completed house in Chells Way. Services were then held in a bedroom of this house until the new purpose-built church in Chells Way was opened on 12 December 1964. St Hugh's Anglican Church also in Chells Way was opened in 1965 and from its very beginning worked closely with the Methodist Church. A joint newsletter representing both churches was circulated for many years [see NM6B/9].

The Methodist church was closed in 1985 and the building sold to Hertfordshire County Council for use as a day centre.

### St Paul's Methodist Church, Broadwater, Stevenage

A meeting was held in August 1948 to appoint trustees for the development of a church and Sunday School at Broadwater. Initially a garage was converted for use as a Sunday School. Stevenage Development Corporation offered a site off the Hertford Road and a wooden hut was purchased and erected for use as a church. This was extended in 1953 by the addition of a second hut. A site for a permanent church was acquired adjacent to Broadwater Crescent and Turpin's Rise and the foundation stone was laid on 10 April 1954. This new church designed by Paul Mauger and Partners was officially opened on 21 May 1955. The building was registered for the solemnization of marriages in 1958. Further alterations were made in 1969 to provide an additional school room. A manse, 53 Stanmore Road, Stevenage purchased in 1953 was sold in 1970.

## Introduction

## Watford Primitive Methodist Circuit

Watford Primitive Methodists were worshipping in a room in Hedges Yard, High Street by 1840. A chapel was in use in Carey Place, Watford by 1865 [see NM7J]. The circuit also included chapels at Croxley Green [see NM7M], Letchmore Heath [see NM7P], Bushey [see NM7N], Redbourn [see NM5G] and St Albans. In 1877 the chapels at Redbourn and St Letchmore Albans formed themselves into a separate Primitive Method-For later details concerning chapels in ist circuit. these two places see NM5. By 1893 the Watford circuit included the chapels at St Albans Road and Queen's Road Watford, Bushey Heath, Croxley Green, Aldenham and Chorleywood. A further church in Whippendell Road, Watford was opened in 1903,[see NM7I-P]. For a short period from 1897 this circuit also included Northwood and Ruislip, Middlesex. In 1901 a separate Harrow Mission was formed and the Northwood and Ruislip churches were removed from the Watford plan.

On the union of the Methodist churches in 1933 the Primitive churches were constituted a separate circuit named Watford (No 2). Not until 1947 were the former Primitive and Wesleyan (Watford No 1 circuit) churches united as one circuit. See below for further details.

#### Watford Wesleyan Methodist Circuit

A Wesleyan Society was first formed in Watford in 1808. Services were held in the Market Place then later in a room in Hedges Yard, High Street. In 1813 Watford formed part of the Luton Circuit. Records of this Circuit are now held by Bedfordshire Record Office, County Hall, Bedford MK42 9AP. A chapel was erected in Water Lane in 1814 and a second chapel opened in 1838 in Farthing Lane. By this date Watford was included in the St Albans Circuit [see NM5]. The Farthing Lane chapel was closed in 1868 on the opening of the chapel in Queen's Road [see NM7A].

### Watford Wesleyan Methodist Circuit (cont)

A separate Watford circuit was formed in 1872 and as well as Watford and Rickmansworth also included the societies at Pinner, Eastcote and Harefield in Middlesex transferred from the Uxbridge circuit. In 1904 this circuit was amalgamated with the Hemel Hempstead circuit to include Watford (churches now existed in Queen's Road, Vicarage Road and St Albans Road, Watford and Villiers Road, New Bushey), Rickmansworth, Harefield, Pinner, Eastcote, Heronsgate, Hemel Hempstead, Nash Mills, Two Waters, Berkhamsted, Kings Langley and Abbotts Langley. The section including Heronsgate, Northwood, Eastcote, Pinner, Harefield and Rickmansworth was transferred to the Harrow circuit in 1922.

On the union of the Methodist churches in 1933 the Watford Wesleyan churches remained as a separate circuit known as Watford (No 1) consisting of Queen's Road, Vicarage Road and Harebreaks (formerly known as St Albans Road) Watford, Bushey and Oxhey (formerly Villiers Road, New Bushey), Hemel Hempstead, Nash Mills, Two Waters, Berkhamsted, Cupid Green, Kings Langley and Abbotts Langley. The Watford Primitive churches St Albans Road and Whippendell Road, Watford, Bushey Heath, Croxley Green, Aldenham and Chorleywood forming Watford (No 2) circuit. Not until 1947 were the two circuits amalgamated, with the addition of Rickmansworth and Harefield from the Harrow circuit to form a new Watford circuit.

The Hemel Hempstead and Berkhamsted circuit was formed in 1957 and the following chapels from the Watford circuit were transferred to it: Hemel Hempstead (Marlowes and Wesley), Two Waters, Boxmoor (opened 1953) and Nash Mills [see NM3].

The church at Springwell Avenue, Mill End, Rickmansworth was transferred to the Watford circuit from Chalfont and Chesham in 1958. It was closed in 1964 on the opening of the new church in Berry Lane, Rickmansworth. Harefield was transferred to Uxbridge circuit in 1958. The church at Cupid Green was closed in 1955 and at Chorleywood in 1969. A church at Carpenders Park, Watford in Prestwick Road was opened in 1953 and Queen's Road, Watford closed in 1966.

The Watford circuit now includes the churches at Whippendell Road, Vicarage Road, Harebreaks and Carpenders Park, Watford, Bushey and Oxhey, Bushey Heath, Rickmansworth (Berry Lane and High Street), Croxley Green, Abbotts Langley and Kings Langley.

The Watford circuit now forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist Church

# Queen's Road Methodist Church, Watford (Wesleyan) NM7A

The first Wesleyan chapel to be built in Queen's Road, Watford was opened on 16 December 1869. This replaced a chapel in Farthing Lane, Watford opened in 1838. The foundation stone of a new church was laid 30 May 1888 and consecrated on 16 January 1889. It was found that major structural repairs were required to the building by the 1960's and the church was finally closed in 1966. The site was sold and the buildings demolished for redevelopment. The congregation amalgamated with Whippendell Road. (see NM7K)

A Wesleyan society in North Watford was first formed in 1898 when services were held in the Co-operative Hall. In June 1900 iron and materials were purchased for the erection of a church at Callow Land at the corner of St Albans Road and Regent Street. Opening services were held on 24 October 1900. This was replaced in 1928 by the church and school at Harebreaks. Harebreaks was renamed North Watford in 1971 on its amalgamation with the former Primitive church in St Albans Road, Watford (see NM7I). Renovations and alterations were carried out in 1975 with the addition of a large extension known as Unity Hall

In 1886 it was transferred to the newly formed Hemel Hempstead circuit (see NM3). The church was transferred to the Watford circuit in 1904. It was extensively renovated in 1962.

At first services were held in various locations, a cottage at Bankside Downs, Chorley Wood Road, Blackett's Farm, Heronsgate and later a house in the High Street are known to have been used. A permanent church had certainly been erected in the High Street by 1841. After a disastrous fire in 1865 the church was completely rebuilt to the design of a Mr Pearson. An adjoining site was purchased in 1925 for the erection of new church hall and school room. This building, opened in 1931, became known as the Cloisters Hall.

From 1854 until 1872 Rickmansworth formed part of the Uxbridge circuit. It then became part of the newly constituted Watford circuit. However in 1922 it was transferred to the Harrow circuit until again in 1947 it became part of the larger Watford circuit. A resident Minister was accommodated from this date at a newly purchased manse 34 Nightingale Road, Rickmansworth.

## Cupid Green Methodist Church St Agnell's Lane, Hemel Hempstead

## St Albans Road Methodist Church, Watford (Primitive) NM73

A site was purchased by the Watford Primitive Methodists in St Albans Road in 1890 and an iron chapel was erected the following year. The foundation stones of a permanent church were laid in June 1897 and the building formally opened in May 1898. A new church hall was erected in 1960.

In 1971 this church was closed and sold to the Elim Trust Corporation. The congregation amalgamated with the former Wesleyan church at Harebreaks, Watford (see NM7B).

The Harwood's Farm Estate in Watford was sold for development at the turn of the nineteenth century. The Primitive Methodists purchased two cottages 113 and 115 Harwoods Road on this estate and regular services were held at number 115 from April 1901. Adjacent land was purchased for building and the road re-named Whippendell. The foundation stone of the new chapel was laid in March 1903 and the building opened in June of the same year. The chapel was wholly rebuilt in 1937 and the congregation amalgamated with the older Queen's Road society (see NM7J). The cottages in Whippendell Road were finally sold in 1957. This church was again extensively rebuilt in 1966 when the former Wesleyan church in Queen's Road, Watford was closed and the congregations united (see NM7A).

A Primitive Methodist chapel first opened in 1852 at the foot of Clay Hill, Bushey. The building later became a theatre for Sir Hubert Herkomer and a film studio. An iron chapel erected in The Rutts, Bushey Heath on land purchased from a Mr Taylor of Stanmore was formally opened on 24 June 1883. This building still stands and is at present used by the Girl Guides Association. A new site in the High Road was offered to the connection in 1888 and a new chapel opened here in 1891. By 1961 this building was considered too uneconomical to repair. It was demolished in 1967 and the site redeveloped as shops. Services were continued in a prefabricated iron building while the new church was being erected on the site of 69 High Road, Bushey Heath. The modern church now known as St Andrew was opened on 14 September 1968.

## Aldenham Methodist Church (Primitive)

NM7P

A small society of Primitive Methodists were meeting in Aldenham from September 1870. However it was not until December 1874 that they were able to rent an iron mission room at Letchmore Heath. This building was purchased in 1885 by Henry Hucks Gibbs for use as a social club so the Methodists were unable to use it again. They resorted to meeting on Letchmore Heath and in the blacksmith's forge when the weather was inclement. Frederick William Thellusson, 5th Baron Rendlesham leased to the society a small plot of land at Four Want Ways, Aldenham in 1886. The foundation stone of a permanent chapel was laid in April the following year and the building was opened for worship on 3 June 1887. The society purchased the freehold of this land in 1959. However falling numbers led to services being suspended in 1965 and the building was leased to the Scout Association. It was finally sold in 1983 for conversion into a private house.

In 1885 an iron church in Villiers Road formerly used by the Plymouth Brethren became available. It was purchased by the Methodists who held their first service there in May 1886. A Sunday School was formed almost immediately which gradually grew in numbers. A new church was soon needed and a site at the junction of King Edward Road and London Road, Bushey was acquired in 1903. Fund raising activities began immediately. The new church designed by C Bell, Withers and Meredith was consecrated on 24 May 1905 and the organ in May 1906. The old iron building was re-erected beside the new church for use as a schoolroom. Houses were later built on the Villiers Road site by local builders. The church was renamed the Bushey and Oxhey Methodist Church in An extension known as the Galahad Room was opened in November 1930 to provide accommodation for the Sunday School and weekday meetings and the iron building finally demolished in 1963 to make way for a new Sunday School Hall. The church was renovated and remodelled internally in 1981-2 during which period services were held in the School Hall. Centenary celebrations were held in 1986. A short history of the Methodist Church in Bushey can be found in NM7Q/55.

#### Introduction

A Methodist Society at Welwyn Garden City was formed in 1943 and at first services were held in the Community Centre. A site was purchased in Ludwick Way in 1946 and a church opened in 1950. The present church designed by Paul v Mauger and David Sutcliffe is a much larger building opened in 1957. At this period Welwyn Garden City formed part of the St Albans circuit (see NM5). The Digswell Lodge Methodist Society holding services in the Vineyard Community Hall was formed in 1959, also under the St Albans circuit.

A Methodist church and hall had previously opened in Warren Way, Digswell and together with the societies at Oaklands and Knebworth formed part of the Stevenage circuit until 1969 (see NM6). Welwyn Garden City was transferred to the Stevenage circuit in 1960.

A separate Welwyn Garden City circuit was formed in 1969 to include Welwyn Garden City, Knebworth, Digswell (Warren Way), Oaklands and Vineyard (Digswell). Records relating to the societies at Knebworth and Oaklands (Welwyn) have been received in the Record Office, (see NM8A and 8B).

The Welwyn Garden City circuit forms part of the London North West District of the Methodist Church.

### Knebworth Methodist Church

A Methodist Society was formed in Knebworth in 1927. Services were at first held in the mission room in Gun Road. A site was purchased from the London North Eastern Railway on North Road in 1934, and a temporary building erected soon after. This was reconstructed as a permanent church in 1965.

From 1930 until 1946 Knebworth formed part of the Hitchin circuit (see NM4). It was then included in the Stevenage and Knebworth Methodist Mission (see NM6) until being transferred to the Welwyn Garden City circuit in 1969.

#### Introduction

John Wesley visited Bishop's Stortford in March 1775 but did not preach there. Until 1885 Bishop's Stortford formed part of the Bishop's Stortford and Hertford circuit (see NM10). At this date a separate Bishop's Stortford circuit was formed which in 1887 amalgamated with the Saffrom Walden Wesleyan circuit to form the North West Essex The Mission included the chapels at Bishop's Stortford, Saffron Walden, Harlow, Hoddesdon, Burnt Hill, Braughing, Little Chesterford, Arkesden, Berden and Sheer-From 1902-12 the Mission was again amalgamated with the Hertford churches to form the much larger London and Hertford Mission circuit. For information relating to this circuit see NM10/11 - 19. In 1912 the North West Essex Mission was again constituted a separate circuit, the chapel at Hoddesdon remaining part of the newly formed Waltham Abbey and Hertford circuit (see NM10). The chapel at Sheering was closed in 1918(see NM9 E) and Sawbridgeworth formed part of the Mission from 1926 until its closure in In 1939 the Mission was amalgamated with the former Primitive Methodist churches of the Saffron Walden circuit (Saffron Walden, Chrishall, Clavering, Hempstead, Ickleton, Langley (Essex), Furneux Pelham, Manuden and Dassells) to form the Bishop's Stortford circuit. Berden was closed in 1942, Burnt Hill was transferred to the Harlow Mission circuit in 1953 and Dassells and Furneux Pelham closed at the same period.

The circuit now includes Bishop's Stortford, Stanstead, Braughing, Saffron Walden, Chrishall, Clavering, Arkesden, Langley and Ickleton and forms part of the London North East District of the Methodist church.

## South Street Methodist Church, Bishop's Stortford (Wesleyan) NM9A

The first Methodist services were held in 1823 under a tree at the Causeway, Bishop's Stortford. A year later a seed warehouse in Church Street was purchased and converted into a chapel. The first minister was appointed in 1828 and the first chapel was erected in South Street, Bishop's Stortford shortly afterwards. This was rebuilt in 1864. In 1902 this chapel was sold and a year later a new chapel was opened on a different site in South Street.

Until 1885 Bishop's Stortford formed part of the Bishop's Stortford and Hertford circuit. The records of this circuit in which much information is to be found concerning individual chapels have been catalogued under NM10. These include baptism registers, 1838 - 1885 containing Bishop's Stortford entries (Ref: NM10/9-10). A microfilm of an earlier register, 1827 - 1837 held by the Public Record Office is also available here (Ref: PC26/1).
