1. 1830 July 28 ✓ LETTER : James Sparrow, Holyhead to Rev. James Williams, Glangwna, near Carnarvon. He draws his ideas of the description of a carriage that ought to be built for Manby's apparatus, and also gives a written description. The operations from their last meeting are at a standstill as Tom Williams, no. 6 has not replied to his letter re. the assent of Hampton to have his name used as proposed in the resolution about the boathouse at Rhoscolyn, and other matters concerning the Anglesey lifeboats. He does not propose to oppose either Mr. Ormsby Gore for the borough of Mr. Wynn of Cefn Amlwch for the county, and therefore does not think it likely that he will visit Glangwna during J.W.'s stay there.
2. 1832 Oct. COPIES OF LETTERS written by Robert Morrah and John Dennet, and a copy certificate concerning the wreck of the ship Bainbridge going from Halifax to London which happened on the night of the 7th [October] on Atherfield rocks. They contain accounts of the shipwreck, the failure of their use of Manby's apparatus to throw a line over the ship, and the successful use of one of Dennet's rockets.
3. 1832 Oct. 25 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams, Llanfair enclosing copies of papers received from the agent to Lloyds in the Isle of Wight re the wreck of the ship Bainbridge, and the rocket apparatus invented by Mr. Dennet. He has also heard from the coast guard stations at Atherfield and has no doubt that it was the means of opening the communication between the ship and shore. The Manby apparatus had repeatedly failed in that object. Two of the coast guard men went to offer their boat and saved 19 passengers in 2 trips. He informs him where the sets of W. Dennet's rocket apparatus were placed by the committee of the shipwreck Institution in 1827.

4. 1833 June 12
LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to James Sparrow esq. The committee has awarded 10s. each to the 10 men who went off in the lifeboat to render assistance in saving the crew of the brig Martha. A draft for £5 is enclosed. He enquires how many were saved. He lists the names of the crew.
5. 1834
DRAFT LETTER : [Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy] to [Charles Williams, City of London Steam Packet Company Office, 27 Water Street, Liverpool] thanking him for his complimentary letter. His gratification would be greatly enhanced if he could enlist the assistance of the company in furthering the cause of humanity by advocating, with the underwriters of Liverpool or Dock Commissioners, the erection of a perch on the rock called Harry's Furlong, the cause of the present disaster.
6. 1834 Jan 14
LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. J. Williams. He is glad to hear that his district has suffered no casualties during the tempestuous weather, and that lifeboat no. 4 has been the means of saving much property and lives. An accident has occurred there. A boat upset and 3 men were drowned. He suggests the addition of 3 or 4 cwt of bar iron lashed to the keelson by way of ballast might prove valuable. They are glad to hear he is in communication with the Hon. W. Mostyn, member for Flintshire, re lifeboats.
7. 1834 March 28
LETTER : Morgan Jones, Cilwen deg to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory, Bodedern. He cannot grant permission to erect any signals on the Skerries Island or for any persons to interfere or make any arrangements with the light keepers.
8. 1834 May 15
LETTER : George Palmer, ?, Epping to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy, Bodedern (erased and replaced by Glangwns Robert Biddulph) He has been laid up with an attack of gout. He has wanted to call on Sparshott and discuss J.W.'s buoy. He makes numerous comments on the usefulness and design of the buoy. He gives his opinions as to the types of boats best suited for service, and

discusses the handling of boats in rough weather and possible design improvements.

9. 1834 May 21 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams expressing the central committee's thanks for the remittance of £30. He encloses the case of the brig Partha. Mr. Palmer has written to him re the life buoy. He requests any information he may have to make clear the contents of an enclosed document [re. a rescue]
10. 1834 July 23 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams requesting an answer to his letter enclosing a memorial from some boatmen which was certified by Rev. W. Jones Parry.
11. 1834 Aug. 15 LETTER : J. Morgan, Carnarvon Bank to Rev. Jas Williams, Llanfairynghornwy giving the state of the fund of the Shipwreck So., which is [short] by £17.15.0.
12. 1834 Nov. 1 LETTER : Charles Williams, City of London Steam Packet Company Office, 27 Water Street, Liverpool to Rev. James Williams, Llanfair expressing the thanks of the company to the lifeboat crew in saving three of their men who had been driven to sea in their boat in a severe gale. He wishes to present £5 to each of the men.
13. 1834 Nov. 7 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams. He requests particulars concerning 2 cases which J.W.'s lifeboats have been involved in recently and which he has seen in the newspapers and Lloyd's lists. He also requests the names of all the places where they have lifeboats and apparatus situated.

14. 1834 Nov. 15 COPY LETTER : [Rev. James Williams] Llanfairynghornwy to the City of Dublin Steam Packet Co., acknowledging receipt of £35 for the crew of the Anglesey Life Boat no. 1, stationed at Cemlyn. He will return £5 as only 6 men were involved, and awaits their further directions.
15. 1834 Nov. 26 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to the Royal Humane Society, Bridge Street, Blackfriars. Their cases will be laid before the committee. The gallant act of the boy mentioned deserves great praise but cannot come under their cognizance. It would be a bonus to him if the surplus £5 held from the Dublin Steam Packet Co. could be given to him. He suggests that the Royal Humane Society might give him a medal if he presented the case to them.
16. 1834 Dec. 4 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams. The committee have deferred their consideration of the two cases of saving lives by lifeboats no. 1 and no. 2.
17. 1835 Jan 14 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy. The committee have adopted his recommendation in making an award to the crew of the lifeboat in the case of the Mary and a draft is enclosed. They were glad to hear that the crew of lifeboat no. 2 have received ample reward from the owners of the Leeds steampacket. The silver medal of the institution has been granted to Owen Williams, the coxwain.
18. 1835 March 30 LETTER : Charles Williams, City of Dublin Steam Packet Company, Office, 27 Water Street, Liverpool to Rev. James Williams, Llanfair Rectory. He suggests that the odd £5 after rewarding the crew of the lifeboat should be introduced to the institution's account.

19. 1835 May 1 LETTER : Richard Preece,? Bunk, Carn. to Rev. Jas. Williams, Llanfairynghornwy furnishing him with a copy of the shipwreck account.

20. 1835 June 22
- LETTER : William Hillary, Fort Anne, Isle of Man to Rev. James Williams, secretary to the Shipwreck Institution, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory. He apologises for not writing. When his lifebuoys are to be had they will be glad to avail themselves of one for each of their lifeboats. He suggests that 3 or 4 beackets or hoops should be placed around the middle of the buoy to give a secure hold to anyone who reaches it. The size could be further increased. Experience will show whether the addition of a lead weight at one end would be advantageous. The winter has been severe and some lives have been lost off their coast.
21. 1835 July 31
- LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams. The medal voted to the coxwain of lifeboat no. 1 can be altered to anyone he wishes. The committee wish to inform him that in the case of saving the crew of the barque William by the crew of the lifeboat no. 4 the committee have given rewards as stated. A draft is enclosed for distribution. Messrs. Erdale and Co. have not received any information from Messrs. William Hughes and Co. of Carnarvon to pay the £30.

22. 1835 Sept. 19
- LETTER : W. Owen, Holyhead to Rev. James Williams giving a detailed account of the occurrence of saving the crew of the American ship Plutarch, wrecked on the south east side of Holyhead Bay on the 10th inst. He describes the launching of the lifeboat and the process of reaching the crew of the ship. 3 of the men refused to go out a second time. All the other men acted courageously and deserve rewards. He comments on the behaviour of the lifeboat in the sea.
23. 1835 Oct. 2
- LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams. The £30 has been paid from the Bangor bank to their bankers. He has sent him 10 copies of the eight report. They include statements of trials re. Bennett's rockets and he gives the cost of a set of apparatus. Mr. Bennett is very slow in his operations.

24.

1835 Oct. 7

LETTER: Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams. He is directed by the committee of the shipwreck institution to acquaint him that they have voted the gold medalion of the institution to be presented to Captain William Owen for his conduct in the case of the ship Plutarch. The silver medal is to be presented to Richard Morris, and 2 sovereigns each to Morris and the other 6 crewmen. In the case of the ship Sarah 2 sovereigns are awarded to John Smith and 1 sovereign each to the other 3 men. A draft for £19 is enclosed. He requests to know how to convey the medals to him. He suggests that the case might be inserted in the Liverpool newspapers as a stimulus to their funds.

25.

1835 Oct. 13

LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams at B.L. Watson esq., Telegraph Office, Liverpool. He has sent him a packet containing 10 reports and a gold medal each for himself and Captain Owen. He will withhold the silver medal for Richard Morris until he hears from him on the subject. He thinks that a statement of the facts of the two cases inserted in the Liverpool papers would do good. They have in the last 10 years been subjected to considerable expenses for serving the lives of seamen going to and from Liverpool.

26.

1835 Oct. 29

LETTER : Bernard L. Watson, Telegraph Office, Liverpool to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy, Bodedern, Anglesey. He discusses a forthcoming trip. He thinks he may travel in a gig. He discusses the buoy, and will see Capt. Denham. He does not agree that the subscription would succeed better to the parent institution. He will forward the wire and attend to the frigate pulleys.

27.

1835 Nov. 4

LETTER : William Hillary, Fort Anne, Isle of Man to Rev. James Williams. He was glad to receive his previous year's report with its gratifying statement of lives rescued by the efforts of their volunteer crews. He hopes others will follow their example. He praises their efforts in rescuing many lives during the dreadful weeks which have taken place. He is glad that the Royal National Institution has conferred the gold medal upon him.

 LETTER : Geo. Withers, treasurer, Liverpool
 to Rev. Jas Williams, Anglesey. The sum
 of £20, awarded by the trustees of the
 Liverpool docks has been paid to John Crosbie
 surveyor to the Ocean Insurance Company,
 to whom a memorial was transmitted by the
 men employed in saving the crew of the
Plutarch. He refers him to Mr. C. re the
 appropriation of the sums he may collect
 for the purpose of rewarding the individuals

 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. J. Williams quoting extracts from some letters which have got into the hands of the proprietor of the Nautical Magazine reflecting severely on the conduct of Anglesey people re. the wreck of the Flutarch. These are creating some sensation and he requests information to aid him to refute the statements contained in these letters.
34. 1836 Jan 15
 LETTER : Thomas Edwards, London to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy. Mr. Eute, the proprietor of the Nautical Magazine does not feel justified in giving the names of the parties from whom he received the letters re. the Flutarch. He has published some extracts in the January copy, no. 47, and a copy is enclosed.
35. 1836 Jan 18
 LETTER : James Rees, Carnarvon to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory replying to his letter concerning [an article contained in] the Nautical Magazine. Mr. Bransby had received a letter in his private capacity from the proprietor/editor of the Nautical Magazine and his reply seems to have been mis-stated or misinterpreted. As this may do their firm harm he urges him to do all he can to 'saddle the foul aspersion upon the real author' and offers his assistance. He comments upon the hospitability of Anglesey people.
36. 1836 Jan 18
 LETTER : James ? Hens Bransby, Bron yr hendref, Carnarvon to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy replying to his letter re the Nautical Magazine. He relates the contents of a letter received from a gentleman connected with the Carnarvon Herald and of his reply to it, concerning the treatment giving by Anglesey people to sufferers in an American wreck. He thinks the writer in the Nautical Magazine has acted imprudently and unjustly in using him as an authority.
37. 1836 Jan. 25
 LETTER : J.G. Johnstone, Holyhead to Rev. James Williams, Life Boat Institution, Llanfairynghornwy giving an account of assistance rendered by the lifeboat crew to a brig that was drifting onto the Clippel Rocks. He gives a list of the men who comprised the crew and recommends that they be rewarded.

38. 1836 March 9
 LETTER : H.M. Denham, Marine Surveyors Office, Liverpool to ? He has been busy with the preparations of official documents re. Mr. Humes' lighthouse bill. He relates the cause of the Forsby lifeboat disaster and gives the dimensions of the boat. He believes the boat in question might be much improved by having poles attached above the waterline. The surviving cases of distress have been somewhat mitigated by the receipt of £90 from the community and £550 from the Dock Trust. He sends the lifebuoy as desired. It is much admired.
39. 1836 June 17
 LETTER : Capt. H.M. Denham, marine surveyors office, Liverpool to Rev. Jas Williams, Llanfairynghornwy giving his reasons for the delay in paying the money to the crew who went to the aid of the Plutarch. He records Mr. Crosbie's success in obtaining an additional £2. on top of the award of £20 by the Dock Committee, by application to local bodies. £4 was appropriated for the purchase & inscribing of a silver snuff box for Owens master of the Lord Stanley. Whoever puts up the Harry Furlong perch will also be obliged to keep it up. He has had all the buoys re-served with white lines and a solution of india rubber.
40. 1836 June 18
 LETTER : Geo Withers, Liverpool to Rev. Jas. Williams, Llanfairynghornwy enclosing a bill for £18 to be distributed to the men responsible for saving the lives of the crew of the Plutarch. The names of the men are given. A silver snuff box with inscription is ready for Mr. Owen master of the Stanley, who accompanied the men on this occasion.

 LETTER : Geo Withers, treasurer, Liverpool to Rev. Jas. Williams, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory. The box for Captain William Owen is ready. Should his wife wish to have it before his return from sea he will deliver it to any authorised person.

 EXTRACT LETTER : Mr. Reece, Carnarvon to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy used as envelope present only

43. 1836 Sept. 5
LETTER : William Hughes, Madyn Iysw to Rev. I. Wynne Jones, Holyhead giving an account of the assistance rendered by Amwch men to the Union schooner of Beaumaris which nearly ended in the death of the two men who were given further aid by two men from the sloop Mary of Beaumaris. He begs him to lay the facts of the matter before the next meeting of the committee of the Humane Society. He lists the names of the men involved.

The committee have awarded 2 sovereigns to Owen Roberts and 30s. each to the other 6 men for their laudable conduct on lifeboat no. 4 in the case of the Fike. In the case of the Lady of New Lake the committee have awarded 1 sovereign each to the 5 men who went in the boat. A draft for £18 is enclosed which includes the £2. due in the case of the Mutarch. They are glad the lifeboats are in a state of perfect repair and equipment. He discusses a compass and binnacle in the possession of Mr. Preston. He has not been given instructions to communicate with Mr. Wilkinson of Pall Mall.

1837 Dec. 6

LETTER : John Bennett, New Village near Newport, Isle of Wight to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory describing in detail the complete rocket equipment which he normally supplies to a station. He explains why he cannot charge less for the equipment. Should he order several sets of equipment he will subscribe 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of the amount to the funds of the institut. He has provided smaller rockets for the Northumberland branch of the R.N. Institution for practice. He discusses various trials with his rockets. He was glad to see the report, and wishes him success with his "messenger (lifebuoy)"

55.

1838 Feb. 24

LETTER : Hugh Jones, Rectory, Beaumaris to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy, concerning the amount of money it would cost to send iron bars by rail. He will help carry any of the plans into execution. They cannot afford to let the present materials slip through their hands. The letter is continued on 26 February: He received his letter that morning and immediately got the names of the saved from the Captain. He is unsure how to fill in the forms sent to him. He has the bill but does not like to enclose them because postage. He has written to the Admiralty concerning £2. which the Accountant General of the Navy has been ordered to pay him. He will send the letters and that received from Captain Beechy on to him. He discusses newspaper accounts of the behaviour of the men in rescuing the crew of the Liverpool. The town clerk informs him that a specific Act of Parliament empowers 3 magistrates to compel the owners of a vessel to remunerate crews of boats for saving lives.

1838 March 8

LETTER : J. Herbert, Trinity House, London to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy Rectory, Anglesey. He acknowledges receipt of his letter re the utility of the lifeboat stationed at Penmon Point. The Board direct that he inform him that the Corporation has felt it necessary to decline to accede to various applications and suggest that they apply to the "Royal National Institution for the preservation of Life from Shipwreck".

57. 1838 April 16

LETTER : Hugh Jones, Rectory, Beaumaris to Rev. James Williams, Llanfairynghornwy, Anglesey. En dorse he will find a certificate from the captain of the barque wrecked near the lifeboat the previous night. He describes how the wreckage occurred, and gives details of the ship, of the crew saved, and the names of the lifeboat crew. He has not written to the newspapers. The Captain has commented that if the pilot boat had been outside he might have been brought in safe. He lists the prices of different articles required for the tramway and suggests that he ride over and settle it.

LETTER : Hugh Jones, minister of Penmon, Beaumaris to ? reporting the wreck of the Scotia at Trwyndu the previous night, and describing events leading up to the wreckage and the rescue by the Penmon lifeboat.
