7. 1887, Dec. 3 LETTER: W. Vincent, Old Banks, Chester to Mr. Fanning Evans. The recent leaps and bounds in the tin and copper market have caused him to think a good deal of Amlwch and future possibilities. Yesterday he had a conversation with a man well conversant with the metal market and was disappointed to find it his opinion that copper

will certainly go down again.
He hopes Mrs Evans is better.

8. 1888, Jan. BUNDLE of correspondence between T.F. Evans and the City Laboratories, London re the samples sent to the Laboratories by Mr. Evans. Includes a CERTIFICATE OF ASSAY for copper precipitate.
9. 1888, Aug. 9 ASSAY CERTIFICATE issued by W.H. Christoe, Assay Office, Truro to T.F. Evans esq. They are transferring to Mr. Evans produce of sample of copper ore settled with I.H. James.
10. 1888, Sept. 25 LETTER: Manager, Lancashire and Cheshire Telephonic Exchange Co. Ltd., Liverpool District to M. Evans Esq., Princes Park, Liverpool re a private telephone wire which is to be installed at the Mona Mines.
11. 1889, June 25 MEMORANDUM: John McInnes & Son, Liverpool to T.F. Evans, Mona Mine, enclosing cheques etc. to the value of £298.16s to settle the account.

22. 1794, Nov. 17 NOTICE of an election to be held at Beaumaris on the 22 November, 1794 to nominate a Member of Parliament to succeed the Honorable William Paget, deceased.

23. 1813, April - Dec. ACCOUNT SHEET.
In a poor condition.
24. 1834 POSTAGE BOOK.
In a very poor condition.
25. 1883, May 22 LETTER: William Lewis, Antwerp to Thomas F. Evans. They are discharging about ten bags of ochre. He hopes that Mr. Evans will have a cargo for him.
26. 1887 LETTER: Col. Hampton Lewis, Henllys, Beaumaris to [T. Fanning] Evans. He cannot help John Williams as he is not on the Trust. He is glad to hear that the Anglesey farmers are not going to turn the land lords out at present.
27. 1887, March MEMORANDUM: Meynell and Sons., Brass Founders, Wolverhampton to Gas Co., Anlwich asking for more details re the items they ordered.
28. 1887, March LETTER: William Lewis, Antwerp to Thomas F. Evans. They will be ready to sail for home tonight. He hopes Mr. Evans got the money and that he has a cargo for them.

29. 1887, Mar. 22 LETTER: M. Lilly, Colour Manufactory, City Road, Derby to [T. F. Evans]. He was sorry to hear of the accident. He had no intention of claiming a percentage of the earthy matter in the ochre.
30. 1887, March 22 LETTER: Lowe & Co., London to R. Bridson Esq., Mona Lodge, Anlwich. They have notified Mr. Darling of the accident to Mr. Evans but unfortunately Mr. Darling cannot allow any further delay in the settlement of this matter.
31. [1887], June 24 LETTER: T.M. Lilly, London to T. Fanning Evans. Both trucks of ochre have now arrived. The works have been standing three or four

days for the Jubilee. Mr Evans' daughters are quite well and Mr. Lilly will try to make their visit as pleasant as possible.

LETTER: W. Ward, Iron and Metal Merchant, London to Mr. T. Evans, Mona Lodge, Amlwch re the amount of dirt in the iron.

1887, Dec. 15

TELEGRAM: ? Burn, Dolgelly to Evans, Mona, Amlwch enquiring where they can meet.

1887, Dec. 15

LETTER: ? Ernest Boyce, Ordnance Survey Office, Bedford to T. Fanning Evans enquiring re the name and object of the colour works belonging to Mr. Evans.

Endorsed:

DRAFT LETTER: T.F. Evans to Mr. Boyce. The colour works which Mr. Boyce mentions were erected many years ago by a Mr. Parry for the purpose of producing Venetian Red and various shades of yellow ochre. He styled the works the St. Eilian Colour Works. Mr. Evans bought it from Mr. Parry's son twenty years previously. He describes the material produced at the works, including purple shine which is used for painting the bottom of iron ships. The manufacture of venetian red was discontinued.

LETTER: M. Levington, Dashwood House, London to T.F. Evans, Mona Lodge, Amlwch. He has received Mr. Evans' favour but was surprised at its contents. He thought the matter had been sorted out.

LETTER: Edmund Spargo, Civil and Mining Engineer, Liverpool to T. Fanning Evans re the Meyrick Quarry. He can prepare a prospectus if needed. This quarry

was offered to him three times.
He mentions also the Donegal
Granite Company.

38. 1888, Nov. 14 ORDER for five cwts blasting powder from H. Hughes, Llangefnl Lime Works to T.F. Evans.
39. 1889, March 8 LETTER: David Hughes, 1 Fenwick Court, Fenwick Street, Liverpool to T. Fanning Evans, Amlwch. He would like to arrange a meeting when next visiting Bull Bay.
40. 1889, June 13 BILLS (2) for the transfer and discharge of limestones from Moelfre to Amlwch on the Margaret Elizabeth.
41. 1889, Sept. 2 RECEIPTED INVOICE for ochre delivered to T.F. Evans, Amlwch by the Manchester Ship Canal Company.
