LETTER: Secretary, Prudential Approved Societies to Miss L. Hughes, Queen's Nurse, Llangefni referring to her recent application for a grant in connection with Richard Jones's nursing treatment. He regrets having to inform her that no grant will be made in this case.

LETTER: ~~Dr~~ Arnold Davies, County Medical Officer to Mr Williams, Hon. Secretary D.N.A., Llangefni informing him that at a meeting of the Anglesey County Nursing Association the new Regulation of the Central Midwives Board was discussed. The Board has forbidden midwives to perform last offices for any deceased person, except a mother or child whom she was attending as a midwife at the time of death. It was resolved that suitable women should be chosen for this work of laying out the dead, and that the nurse be allowed to supervise and assist this person for a short time.

COPY LETTER: Kathleen Stanley and Emily Matthews, Hon. Secretaries, Plas Llanfawr, Holyhead to Mrs Forcer Evans regarding an insertion in the local papers that Nurses and midwives are forbidden to perform the last offices for the dead, by a new regulation of the Central Midwives Board. This has been done at the request of

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some of the local committee in order to show that they have no option in the matter, and that they dare not allow their nurses to do this sort of work in future. They would like Mrs Forcer Evans to ask the Committee to consider appointing a woman to undertake this work and have instructions from the nurse, and should the nurse be called upon, she would give the name of the woman appointed.
