The following account of the case is taken from Warden Bilson's *The True Difference Betweene Christian Subiection and Unchristian Rebellion*: Preface 'To the Christian Reader' p. 1: (Fellows' Library).
'... there hapned an iniurie to be offered to the inheritance of the Colledge where I am, by a false title derived from before the foundation of the house, and so strengthened on every side with ancient

deeds and evidence, that the forgerie was hard to be discerned, and harder to be convinced, but by infinite searching in the muniments of many Churches and Bishopricks as well as in our owne, and re-examining sundrie large and laborious commissions which they had taken out before my time, to testifie the keeping and justifie the delivering of those suspected deeds and ligiers. To the detecting and impugning of this, no person was or would be used (I speake for the paines and not for the skill) but my selfe, the cause was so huge, the comparing of the circumstances and contrarieties both of deedes and witnesses so tedious: the proof so perplexed and intricate: and the danger so neerly touched the whole state of the house: I was forced for two yeares to lay all studies aside, and addict my selfe wholly first to the deprehending, and then to the pursuing of this falsehood.'

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1. As far as possible this index to Volumes 2 and 3 has been compiled to conform to the index in Volume 1. Again, it is not an index solely to these volumes but to the equivalent numbers in the more detailed Descriptive List prepared for the National Register of Archives and to other lists dealing with College estates. Copies of the Descriptive List can be seen at Winchester College and at the institutions named on p.
2. Again, decisions have generally been made according to R. F. Hunnisett's *Indexing for Editors, British Records Association, Archives and the User, No. 2* (1972).
3. Major place names have been modernised, but exceptions are those names established by College usage, e.g. Fernhamsdean for Vernham Dean and Hamblerice for Hamble. If a place name has not been identified it will appear in its original form in inverted commas, sometimes with a possible identification in square brackets.
4. Minor place names are grouped under each College property and are given in the form in which they appear in the text.
5. County names are those in use prior to the local government reorganisation of 1974. Abbreviations are as given in Hunnisett.
6. Surnames have been partially modernised and again in some cases College usage has been followed. All variations of the name are given in brackets after the form chosen and references made.
