The following collection of Letters were brought at Sotheby's on 2nd March 1965, (Lot 487, 488). The previous owner is not known. Letters from the same correspondent have been grouped together and then placed in a chronological order.

Most of the letters are addressed to the Rev. Henry Dison Gabell (1764-1831), who was a scholar 1779, and then matriculated from New College in 1782. He succeeded G. I. Huntingford as Master of Warminster School, became Second Master of Winchester College in 1793 and then succeeded Dr. Goddard as Headmaster in 1810. In 1823 he retired and spent the rest of his life as Rector of Binfield in Berkshire.

As Headmaster he is a controversial figure for in 1818 there occurred a quite serious rebellion. J. D'E Firth in his "Winchester College" first published in 1949 refers to "Gabell, malicious and user of unfair weapons". While some contemporaries seem to concur with this judgement, others including Thomas Arnold (Scholar 1807), had a very high opinion of him, particularly of his teaching. This paradox may be explained by Gabell's attempts to increase the amount of supervision of his pupils by the masters at a time when such notion was not generally accepted; hence the references to malicious interference.

His correspondence include a number of wellknown contemporaries such as Lord Eldon, whose letters provide the greatest bulk, Viscount Sidmouth, Admiral W.E. Parry, Lord Ellenborough, William Paley, William Lisle Bowles, and Dr. Samuel Parr. Many of them are writing as parents of boys in the School, but others are writing to Gabell as man who shared their cultural interest.

The use of the words "Scholar", "Commoner" and "Fellow" without further qualification refer to Winchester College.

- HG/1 Letter^{to} [] from [] written in pencil, [Archibald Duke of Argyle 1682-1761] re. the provisions of 10 ounces of Black Lead, the removal of an organ, mention of Salt water pond and also mention of correspondence with the Bishop of Ossory [Richard Pococke]. Dated: London 19 June 1760 [No Wykehamist connection]
- HG/2 Letter to Rev. A. Gabell [see F.A.O. Appears to have no connection with Henry Dyson Gabell, Headmaster] from Lord Hertford (1812-1884) concerning Gabell's candidature for the rectory of Binton, Warminster of which Hertford was the Patron - Autograph of Lord Hertford attached Dated: Hertford House Connaught Place [London] 30 June [1779] N.B. Not Archival - and having apparently no Wykehamist connection
- HG/3 Letter to "Dear Harry" [Henry Dyson Gabell] from William Howley in 1728 to become Archbishop of Canterbury who was an exact contemporary of Gabell's at Winchester (Scholar 1779) and New College, later Fellow. Gabell appears to be in Ireland, and the letter is largely concerned with conveying University News, prize essay titles, the death of Harry Peckham (Scholar 1751) and his replacement as Steward to New College by Thomas Caldecott (Scholar 1757). He refers to gambling losses and also refers to Gabell's "passion for gaming", and a confidence trick played on Thomas Nowell, principal of St. Mary's Hall. Dated: 1 February 1787.
- HG/4 Letter to H. D. Gabell from William Paley (1743-1805), author "Evidences of Christianity" and other works politely refusing to comment upon treatise by Gabell concerning Paley's writings. Dated: Lincoln 14 January 1800.

- HG/8 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Edward Maltby (1777-1859) Greek Scholar and a Commoner in 1785. A long letter concerning Maltby's son, the deficiencies of his grammatical knowledge and negligence of his compositions (in the classics), the reasons for this including the general antagonism of Commoners towards work, an attitude which has increased while his son was at the school; and suggested courses of action. There is also a reference to an intended visit by Gabell to Dr. Parr (Parr had been Maltby's teacher at Norwich before he had come to Winchester) in Warwickshire. Dated: 10 February 1813.
- HG/9 Letter to the same from the same thanking Gabell for his help in Maltby's desired but contested election as [teacher at] Lincoln's Inn, his opponent being a Mr. Jackson. He also asks how he was to send on a copy of "Exercises in Greek Verses", which the author, a Mr. Squires of Felsted School, is anxious he should have; also a reference to a son of Mr. Boston being accepted into the School (He does not appear to have come) Dated: Buckden, 12 May 1819.
- HG/10 Letter to the same by the same accompanying a volume of Maltby's sermons, the gift being prompted by a visit of the son (Robert Joseph Mackintosh Scholar 1819) of his friend Sir James Mackintosh. Maltby comments that if one's attitude to criticisms of sacred works was the same as to profane works the cause of Christian union and charity might be prospered. Dated: 8 August 1822.

- HG/14 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Lord Sidmouth (1757-1844) who was a Commoner 1769-72 thanking him "for a fresh proof of kindness which has afforded me particular pleasure. I earnestly hope the young man will do me credit."
Dated: Richmond Park 22 October 1817.
- HG/15 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Lord Eldon (1751-1838) about his grandson, Hon John Scott, Viscount Encombe in 1821 and later 2nd Lord Eldon a Commoner 1817-1823. He has received favourable reports of his work both from Mr. Williams [David, then Second Master] ^{and} Dr. Gabell. His main purpose is to request permission for his son to return two days late.
Dated: Encombe Nr. Corfe Castle, 1 September 1818.
- HG/16 Letter to the same by the same about his grandson (see HG/15). He has been gratified by the great improvement his grandson has made while at Winchester, mentions his own indisposition which prevented him meeting Gabell while he was in London, and also arrangements for sending his grandson to Winchester from London on the Coach.
Dated: 2 February 1818.
- HG/17 Letter to the same by the same with reference to his grandson return on the Saturday in which the holiday terminated which he hopes is not too late. Also refers to his payment of the School fees and his partial recovery from a recent illness.
Dated: 13 February 1819.
- HG/18 Letter to the same by the same expressing his thanks for the care and attention paid to his grandson who has shown a marked improvement though he still "likes to select for himself to what he will give close attention." He has been advised by Gabell to offer his grandson a prize if he makes reasonable progress.
Dated: Encombe 8 September 1819.
- HG/19 Letter to the same by the same. He is now in a position to present the living of Binfield, Berks, one of the most comfortable benefices in the Chancellors Gift, which the previous occupiers estimated to be worth to them between £500 and £600 (a year) an estimate which Eldon does not set much store by.
Dated: 8 May 1820.
- HG/20 Letter to the same by the same. Written in haste "while counsel are arguing before me" Eldon has received information from Gabell about his grandson which causes him much concern [perhaps his illness see HG 31-33] and is waiting to hear John's "account of himself." He refers to the Catholic Question coming before the House of Lords. He forecasts that the Bill will fail by a small majority.
Dated: House of Lords 13 April 1821.

- HG/21 Letter to the same by the same. He is now extremely satisfied with his grandson's progress. The letter^s concerned with the possibility that now Eldon has been "compelled to accept" promotion in the peerage his grandson is entitled to the courtesy title [of Lord Encombe]. Eldon is reluctant, for fear "of turning the boy's head", for this title to be used, but feels that he will have to abide by the College of Heralds decision. Meanwhile he does not want his grandson to know that the matter is under review. DATED: 31st August 1821
- HG/22 Letter to the same by the same conveying to Gabell that the College of Heralds decision that his grandson is entitled to Lord Eldon's second title. He hopes that while his grandson remains at School the words "Lord" or "Lordship" should be used as seldom as possible in case his conduct is effected unfavourably. Dated: 4 October 1821.
- HG/23 Letter to the same by the same expressing his infinite pleasure which a letter from his grandson has given him [presumably some modest remarks about his new title.] He asks permission for his grandson to spend the night of the 29th [October] with him at an Inn in Winchester. Dated: 23 October 1821.
- HG/24 Letter to the same by the same. He has not been able to see as much of his grandson during the holidays as he would have liked because the King's delay in returning from Scotland kept him in London, but what he did see of him pleased him greatly. On his next visit to Winchester he would like to discuss at what age his grandson should go to University. He says that the fashion has been for boys to have some private tuition between School and University but that he himself is against it. He fears that his grandson may return a little late because he is staying with an Aunt who^s guesses will be reluctant to part with him. Dated: 27 August 1822.
- HG/25 Letter to the same by the same. He has received some important information about Gabell's future plans, "to be executed at Christmas 1823" [presumably Gabell's retirement] which he will consider confidential. With regard to his grandson's future he feels that he should go to University in the Spring of 1824 without any private tuition intervening (see HG/24). Gabell has received a complimentary letter which Eldon remarks merely bears out his own high opinion of Winchester Scholars in his Oxford days. Dated: 7 February 1823.
- HG/26 Letter to the same by the same remarking on the excellence of his grandson both in classical learning and in the acquiring of strong principles, much of this being derived from "the care, which has been thrown round him at Winchester!" There is the usual request for his grandson's return to School to be slightly delayed, on Monday September 1st instead of Saturday August 30th. He notes that the time for Gabell's retirement draws near and looks forward to the blessing of retirement at which time "Mr. Brougham won't disturb me he cannot". Dated: 19 August 1823.

- HG/27 Letter to the same from the same. Envelope with note as to where Gabell's reply is to be posted to.
Dated: 19 August 1823.
- HG/28 Letter to the same from the same expressing his gratitude to Gabell. He notes Gabell's comments about his successor, David Williams (Headmaster 1824-35) and Mr. Ridding [C.H., Second Second Master 1824-35] Eldon has been ill. His other complaints have been removed by the Government, "which seems itself to be in its departure." The time of his grandsons entry to Oxford is not fixed.
Dated: Hamilton Place 6 January 1824.
- HG/29 Letter to the same from the same concerning livings at his disposal. He has in fact only about fifteen at his disposal though many of these are through circumstances are only nominally and most of the remainder are of inconsiderable value (see also HG/19) No Date.
- HG/30 Letter to the same from the same asking on behalf the "Scholares Wiccaminici" on Wednesday. He does not know whether he should also approach the Warden. No Date.
*a remission (a day off school)
- HG/31 Letter to the same from the same concerning the health of his grandson. Lady Eldon is too ill to be informed of her grandson's illness. Discussion of the Catholic Question is postponed until Monday
No Date (See HG/20)
- HG/32 Letter to the same from the same. His grandson is apparently recovering from his illness and Eldon is much relieved by Gabell's last letter. He thinks it better that he should remain at school unless circumstances greatly change.
No Date.
- HG/33 Letter to the same from the same. He is a little worried that he has no further news about his grandson's health. Though he takes no news to be good news. He asks Gabell to write to relieve the anxiety of his grandsons mother and his own wife.
No Date.
- HG/34 A letter to the same from the same. He is delighted to hear that his grandson has reached the highest form in the School. He thanks Gabell for the kind enquires about his health. Apparently his illness had led to much public pressure for him to resign the Lord Chancellorship and there is much comment on his "effects of a licentious press". He is only interested in the opinion of good men which he does not feel he has forfeited. He is coming to Winchester with Lady Eldon and asks permission for his grandson to spend the night with him. No Date.

- HG/35 Letter to H. D. Gabell from C. Abbott (1st Lord Tenterden 1762-1832)
It begins "You will be sensible that I cannot without great reluctance address you a letter" It concerns the withdrawal of his son [son. Charles Abbott] and the arrangement for the collection of his clothes and books. (An Abbott is not included in the list of Commoners expelled as a result of the Rebellion, 7 May 1818, but does appear in the list in C. W. Minots diary of 1818, W.C.M. 24149)
Dated: [Russell Square] 16 May 1818
Endoned: "No answer necessary".
- HG/36a Letter to H. D. Gabell from Sir James Mackintosh (Lt. Governor of Antigua) thanking him for a "great act of kindness" to his son (Robert Joseph Mackintosh, Scholar 1819) Asks if Gabell's son might not act as his son's guide a relationship which he understands is part of the constitutions of the School (The systems still continues)
Dated: Mardock near Ware, 6 August 1819.

- HG/37 Letter to the same from the same. He has received a letter from Gabell which has removed any doubts he may have had about his sons progress particularly with regard to his Industry, though apparently he has a deficiency in one branch of his exercises. He hopes that his son will still have a chance for New College.
Dated: Mardock near Ware, 31 January 1822.
- HG/38 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Charles Wordsworth [Second Master 1835-46]
He is glad that his sons (Christopher Wordsworth the Commoner 1820-24, later Headmaster of Harrow, Bishop of Lincoln and John Wordsworth commoner 1820-22) are doing well. He would be happy to admit Gabell's son (James Henry Leigh Gabell Scholar 1816) a place at Trinity but cannot offer him rooms in College because of the great pressure of numbers.
Dated: Trinity College, Cambridge, 8 February 1821.
- HG/39 Letter to H.D. Gabell from A. Rees (1743-1825 Encyclopaedist and Dinenting Minister) Asks if the son of Edward Archer Wilde might gain entrance into the School and "enjoy the distinguished privilege of being members of your family". They have a common friend in Dr. Parr (see HG/12,13) (The request seems to have been granted, Charles MORRIS Wilde, Commoner 1824-28).
Dated: Denmark Hill 15 July 1822.
- HG/40 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Philip H. Shuttleworth (Scholar 1796, Warden of New College 1822, Bishop of Chichester, 1840). Has received from Gabell a prior copy of the "Ad portas speech" which he finds too complementary. In a P.S. he asks if he can be excused answering it. He is very anxious to kill the rumour that he is anxious to change the system of "Election Chamber". Even if he was no, change would or could be made without consultation with the Election's (elections to New College).
Dated: New College, 30 June 1823.

- HG/41 Letter to H. D. Gabell from W. Parry (Admiral W. E. Parry 1790-1855 the arctic explorer). He is very anxious that Gabell should know that he had been to London (the reason is not clear). He is sending an H. S. Chapter containing an account of Eskimos and would very much appreciate it if Gabell would make some comments on the language of the Eskimos so that he might avoid "the fangs of criticism which even a seaman in these days of polish and refinement, is expected to steer clear of".
Dated: Newbury 15 December 1823.
- HG/42 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Sir Walter Scott concerning conflicting reports about Rev. John Williams the proposed Rector of the new Edinburgh Academy School. Rumour had it that despite his great attainments he is bad-tempered and unpopular and Scott asks Gabell for his opinion for Williams had been an assistant Tutor at Winchester from 1814 to 1818. William's behaviour was considered to be one of the main causes of the rebellion of 1818 by committees of New College and as a result he had been asked to leave. He infact secured the post no doubt because Scott had been impressed by William's ability as private Tutor to his son Charles.
Dated: Edinburgh 8 March [1824.] N.B. GABELL'S REPLY IN THE POSSESSION OF THE EDINBURGH ACADEMY
- HG/43 Letter to H. D. Gabell from Charles Farr Burney [son of the classicist Charles Burney] He is writing as Chairman of the Society of Schoolmasters requesting Gabell to accept the position of Vice-President.

Gabell from William Lisle Bowles (G.1762, Scholar 1775, author and poet) apologising for not having called in on Gabell as had been his intention, but his coachman - he dislikes post-horses so travels with his own - mistook the way. He has ended up at "the Rose" Inn celebrated in the ballad of "Moffy Mogg of the Rose".
