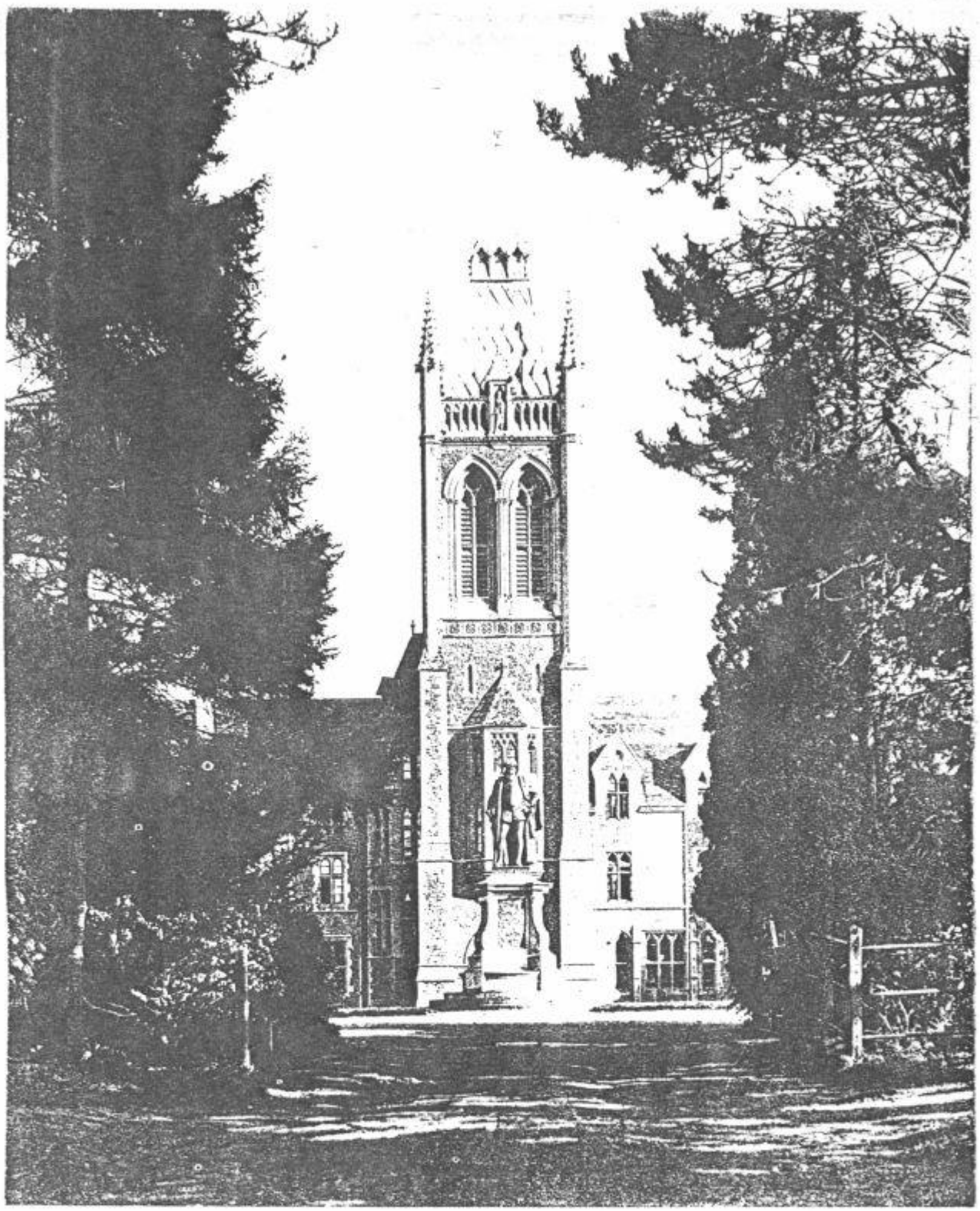

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# THE ARCHIVE OF CHARTERHOUSE AT GODALMING

## HISTORY & NATURE

### Record-Keeping in the Statutes

The Statutes for Thomas Sutton's foundation approved by the Governors on 21 June 1627 made very careful provision for the proper keeping of its records, or "evidences". There was to be an Evidence House [or Strong Room]. Every time a writing was taken out for use by the solicitor its particulars were to be entered in a book by the Master. Its return was to be noted and initialled by whoever received it. A copy of every document of every kind - deeds, surveys, counterparts of leases, bonds, orders, decrees - was to be made in a ledger book, 'fairly written'. In the Evidence House were to be kept several chests, all with a number of keys held by different persons, for the storage of valuables.

The Register [Registrar] was to engross in an Assembly Book all the Orders made by the Governors in an Assembly, and all those present were to sign within forty days. The Manciple was to keep a book of his weekly expenses, and twice a year make an inventory of everything in the Hospital. These careful provisions extended to the Schoolmaster, who was to keep a book of all admissions and all scholars sent to University or Trade, 'with a particular and punctual setting down of the day and year of their coming in and going out'.

It is curious that neither the Public Schools Act of 1868, which set in train the decision to move to Godalming, nor the alterations in the original Statutes of the foundation which followed, made any provision for the keeping of records relating to the pupils. All Statutes and Regulations relating to the School were to be repealed after the Queen in Council had approved the new Statutes (Nov 1872). It is not necessary here to notice many of these, which regulated the conduct of the School in great detail in many respects. They altered the age of admission and departure, and stated what subjects were to be taught, and what the tuition and boarding house fees should be, and the ratio of Masters to boys.

Almost all the clauses relating to records were concerned with finance. The new Governing Body were to see that full accounts were kept of all the School's receipts and expenditures, an annual balance sheet passed, and two bank accounts set up: one at Child's Bank for the School Fund (or moiety) coming from the Hospital revenues; and the other for the Tuition Fund, from boys' fees, at Coutts. When the Headmaster passed bills to the Secretary he was first to mark them as approved by himself. He was to receive £50 p. a. to pay for assistance in keeping the School accounts. The Minutes of the proceedings of the Governing Body were to be entered in a Minute Book. The Headmaster was to make an annual report to the Governing Body, in which he was to include the names of those

employed by the School and their salaries. In the earliest years the Annual Report of the Headmaster was copied into the Minute Book, but it seems that not all of these valuable documents have survived.

The Charity Commission's 1872 Scheme for Sutton's Hospital includes a number of clauses referring to the School. Again, these are largely concerned with finance, and also with property: at first the buildings at Godalming were not under the control of the new Governing Body, but held in trust for them by the Governors. The duties of the official now called the Registrar included keeping lists or registers of nominations and admissions to the Foundation. One cannot but wonder, fleetingly, whether he was intended to include the Scholars at Godalming, but this seems unlikely.

#### **Subsequent Statutes, Orders in Council, Charity Commission Orders**

The Statutes of 1912 which replaced those of 1872 gave the Governing Body powers to appoint a Secretary, Bursar and Auditor, and those of 1977 detailed the duties of the Clerk, but neither of these makes any reference to the classes of records to be kept nor indeed to the keeping of records at all. The Statutory Instrument of 1983 giving effect to the Charity Commission's Scheme for Sutton's Hospital repeats the obligation to keep records of the arrivals and departures of all Brothers. No enactment since 1872 has made any further reference to record-keeping in the School.

Since the clauses of the original Charter which imposed upon the Schoolmaster the obligation to keep a record of the Foundation Scholars were repealed in 1872, after that date no one was responsible for the keeping of records about pupils. We must be grateful that Haig Brown and his successors continued the practices of their predecessors.

#### **Records of the School before 1872**

All the original records of the School kept by the Schoolmasters, surviving from 1680, are now at Godalming. We have no evidence as to when they came, but if not in 1872 we may probably assume that it was soon after. During his nine years as Headmaster in London Dr Haig Brown would already have become accustomed to having charge of them. Dr Hale's copy, which carries the record back to 1641, was probably kept with the original registers. The main series now at Godalming that start before 1872 are listed at the beginning of the class "Pupils" under numbers 26/ - 39/ .

#### **Records and Record-Keeping since 1872**

The statutory records of the Governing Body have been carefully preserved by the Clerk (now Clerk & Bursar). The older volumes have now been transferred from his safe to the Archives, where one or two were found to need treatment for the removal of mould.



The survival of accounts, whether of the whole School or of its officers or of Houses, has been patchy. A quantity of records listed by his staff is kept by the present Accountant in the loft over his office: copies of these lists, with a recommendation as to what should be permanently preserved, are in a binder in Archives (76/ ). Three early volumes of House Accounts, for Saunderites, then the Headmaster's House, cover the years 1898-1911 (64/1-3). Other groups of accounts in other Houses cover much of the period between 1911 and 1974, when most Housemasters ceased to be responsible for catering as well as all domestic arrangements in their Houses.

The records of Houses - and their survival - vary as the natures and interests of their Housemasters and senior pupils dictate (64/ - 75/). Most Houses kept Annals in fine bound volumes, also Minutes of the House Library Committee (which, under the supervision of the Housemaster and Head of House, took a part in the running of the House). Photograph Albums contain annual photos of the House, and of its teams. From time to time House Magazines were produced by almost all the Houses (128/ - 138/ ).

The records of School societies (107/ and 108/) have survived less well than those relating to games (109/ - 120/ ). This is probably because a Secretary took the books home at a moment when no more enthusiasm (or officers) existed. It is much to be hoped that some of these lost books will re-appear, perhaps particularly the Minutes of the Poetry Society, which must include references to the most notable recent Carthusian poet, Robert Graves.

Most of the non-current records of the Chapels, Corps, Library, Bookshop and Music School are now in the Archives, and give a reasonably complete picture of the activities of these Departments. The records of the Corps, now a much smaller part of school life than it once was, are particularly notable, with cadets' names from the beginning in 1873 and a series of files covering all activities 1918-1953 (88/ ). Some other departments keep their own records, though there have been deposits from the Ben Travers Theatre (96/ ) and Studio (94/ ).

The assurance that records handed over to Archives can remain closed for a long period has meant that invaluable files from the Headmaster and Housemasters will now be preserved in the form in which they were created. It has been possible to reconstruct some of the files of earlier (i.e. before 1973) Headmasters; they (or their secretaries) tended to hand over "interesting" and often bland papers which were then filed under subject headings. (44/ - 55/ ). Brooke Hall, a term used both for the Masters and their House or Common Room, will no doubt in time gain enough confidence in a secure Strong Room to entrust the records of their various committees - however informally kept - to the archives, to be kept closed (61/ ).

Special mention should be made of the fine graphic collection, containing many works by OCs John Leech and Max Beerbohm, items relating to Robert Baden Powell and his exploits, including a run of the Orders or Notices he issued from Mafeking in 1899-1900 (ACC 035), and the manuscript of T L Beddoes' *Scaroni* (ACC 050).

## A R R A N G E M E N T

*The Archive consists of thousands of individual "items" (such as volumes, booklets, files), some of which are composed of many "pieces" (the separate letters or papers within a file, for example). The overall arrangement is by classes. These are divided into sections. Every item has its own number, sometimes simply within a section, sometimes as part of a further sub-division, or sub-section. Every piece will eventually be allotted a sub-number.*

*Subordinate to the School's own Archive, described in this list (First Group), are a second and third group. The reasons for the distinct existence of these two further "groups" are explained immediately below.*

### First Group.

The records accumulated by the school as a functioning institution are arranged in classes to reflect the system which created them. They have been allotted numbers in a simple numerical sequence, without any prefixed letters. For example 1/1, the first record described, is a Register of Documents sealed with the Common Seal 1872-1940, and heads the records created by the Governing Body of the School as set up under the Statute of 1868. The whole of this class is numbered in eight sections as 1/1 to 8/7.

The Scheme of Arrangement below shows the main headings of the classification, for example under "Governing Body" only the numbers (but no titles) of the eight sections are given. The titles of these eight sections (i.e. 1/ - 8/ ) will be found in the Summary List which next follows, together with the numbers of documents, or sub-sections, in each section, in this case a total of fifty nine in all. Some details or description of the individual items within each section, for example the eighteen other documents in the first of the eight Governing Body sections, 1/1-19, which is entitled "Statutes, Orders in Council and Related Papers 1627-1983" will be found in the body of the list. This part of the list is called "List with Some Details Included". It still remains, in fact, and in some areas more than in others, a skeleton list. It should be noted that in many cases further details about individual items, or even pieces, will be found in the the manuscript pages of the binders in the Librarian/Archivist's charge &/or in the computerised "Card Box" System.

### Second and Third Groups: General Description

Ever since its arrival in Godalming, and indeed before, the School has received gifts, and has made purchases, of papers and other items connected with the school, its pupils, masters and activities. Those which arrived before the Archive Project started in January 1990 have been given numbers starting with zero and prefaced ACC, for Accession. There are over five hundred and fifty items in this group.

An Accessions Register was opened on 1 January 1990 and all arrivals in the Archives since that date, whether from departments of the School or from outside, are there entered with an ACC number starting 10.

### Second Group

In so far as it has been possible to reconstruct it, items are arranged in the chronological order of their arrival. Thus ACC 01 is the five volumes of the MS of Old Carthusian W M Thackeray's novel *The Newcomes*. With the volumes are the two explanatory letters from the donor, Miss Thackeray, which provide the exact date of their arrival in October 1874. Unfortunately such accuracy is unusual. No list of accessions was kept, though some donations were entered in the Library Accession Register, and careful notes were kept by J L Stokes when Librarian (1905-1947). Some covering letters from depositors have come to light during the process of cataloguing, often in unexpected places remote in context or location from the items concerned. Since most gifts were sent to the Headmaster, other such letters may be found in future among correspondence of Headmasters which is as yet not listed in detail.

The deposits in this second group include much material of great interest and importance for the history of the School. Diaries and letters written by pupils while at school are not strictly part of the records of that school, but they are the best source of information as to what it was like to be a pupil at a particular moment. Most of these, together with school reports and reminiscences and albums, are referred to in the section "Old Carthusians", 175/-188/. The widows and other relations of OCs have also been generous, including those of OCs whose friends later became famous. A number of caricatures drawn by Sir Max Beerbohm while at school arrived in this way (ACC 0151 and 0156).

### Third Group

Accessions since 1 January 1990 which have come from outside the School, and which are therefore of the same type as those in the Second Group, have been treated in the same way. They are described on the "Card Box" computer system (and thus indexed), and in some cases referred to in the appropriate place in the systematic list. For example the weekly letters home written by a Pageite throughout his school career 1925-1931 bear the number ACC 10257 and will be found referred to in section 181/.

Records transferred from the Headmaster, Bursar, Houses, Academic or Administrative Departments, or handed in to the Archives by masters or pupils, are in a different position. On reaching the Archives all are given an ACC 10 number. In the cases where the documents handed over are more than thirty years old and cannot be regarded as confidential, they are also included in the systematic list (First Group). Among these are, for example, those relating to public examination results from 1925. These are numbered 83/. Sometimes, particularly in the case of the transfer of a large quantity of files, the ACC 10 number given to the files on arrival has been retained as a sub-number to the class and

section number later allotted. This applies to almost all files from the Headmaster, Bursar and Housemasters.

All documents which are confidential have been declared closed. This includes records which, without this safeguard, the depositors could not have permitted to enter the Archives. The Headmaster's files, and the Housemasters' files on pupils in their Houses, form the bulk of these. The existence of these now closed records, which will be of vital importance for future historians of the School, is noted in the list, but they cannot be consulted without the permission of the depositor or his successor in office. A closure period of one hundred years has been imposed on most of them, to cover any possible offence or damage to either pupil or master, or to the susceptibilities of their descendants.

All the closed records have been listed under their ACC 10 number in sufficient detail for Housemasters to easily recover files for consultation when asked, for instance, to provide a reference.

#### Some Problems of Classification

The first problem arises from the way in which almost all officials in the past took their papers home. Since they did much of their work there, where secretary and filing systems (if any) were to be found, the habit is not surprising and cannot be condemned, as modern standards would require. Thus we find, for example, that Dr Russell's list of Admissions of Pupils, covering the years 1812-1832, was returned to the School by his descendant Major R W Russell in 1962 (ACC 0226). The fair copy Admissions list among the School's own records (27/2) covers the years 1817-1839. The 1812-1832 volume has thus been restored to the series as 27/1, while retaining also its ACC 0226 number to make its history clear.

An interesting example of how what look like official records have always been in the possession of an official is the collection known as "Townshend Heirlooms" (ACC 058). This consists of the papers, and some deeds, accumulated by two Governors, Charles 2nd Viscount Townshend and Spencer Compton, Earl of Wilmington. The accumulation came to Charterhouse in 1912, probably through the agency of G S Davies, founder of Daviesites and later Master of the Charterhouse. It casts valuable light on the kind of business a Governor had to deal with in the first half of the eighteenth century. A letter from the Duke of Wellington - the Great Duke - shows how this particular Governor was besieged by requests to nominate Gownboys (170/2/5).

In a school such as Charterhouse, where Housemasters retained their financial independence for some time after the arrival at Godalming, and where they still retain autonomy, the records of Houses are in an equivocal position. Because a boy spends so much of his life at school in his House, files and letters about boys kept there are manifestly part of the School's history, and its records. Files on boys - especially naughty boys - contained more confidential material in the past than today, when the telephone has largely replaced letters. When a Housemaster left his House he tended to leave behind the files of boys

still in the House, which his successor would need, together with current account books etc., and take away or destroy everything else.

Since the establishment of an organised archival system, several public-spirited retired Masters and Housemasters have produced records from their cupboards (See 67/25, Girdlestoneite House Accounts 1935-75, and 69/3, Weekite weekly Menu Sheets 1971-1973, and 70/3, Hodgsonite House Accounts 1954-1974). Many older records probably perished when the outlying Houses moved in 1974/5: it is symptomatic that the attics of the Block House Saunderites have produced one of the oldest sets of Housemaster's files, going back to 1957 (ACC 1054). Those of Hodgsonites, however, survive from 1949 (ACC 10283).

Even if Housemaster's records retain their ACC 0 or ACC 10 numbers their existence is indicated in the systematic numerical list.

A rather different problem is inherited from the times when there were few administrative officers and many aspects of the School were run by the Headmaster and Masters. Dr Haig Brown appears not to have had a personal secretary, and Mrs Haig Brown must have carried out many of what would now be regarded as a secretary's functions. Fortunately for posterity she preserved what she regarded as important pieces of paper-work in the albums which were deposited by her daughter Alice in 1936 (ACC 0118). She also evidently preserved her husband's ephemeral writing (for school entertainments or special occasions) as well as much of the voluminous correspondence she kept up with OCs. This useful material was given to the school in 1945 by another daughter, Rosalind (ACC 0150). Apart from these sources virtually the only evidence about the management of the School in its early years at Godalming comes from the Minutes of Meetings of the Governing Body. There are, of course, a number of reminiscences to draw on.

Another similar source to the Haig Brown scrap books are the sixteen large scrap books compiled by F K W Girdlestone, pupil 1856-1863, Assistant Master 1867-1912 and Housemaster 1874-1912. These cover the years 1844-1912, and he gave them to the School in 1919. He apparently started by taking over a book regarded as some sort of official record (see p. 44 of ACC 067/1), and himself gathered up every scrap he thought important. The contents of these large and beautifully bound volumes include seventeenth and eighteenth century items, much that would now be found in the school's own records, and a great deal of unique material relating to other Housemasters and to the careers of famous OCs, notably Robert Baden Powell.

Some records that we would very much like to see are missing. The clause in the 1868 Charterhouse Act which stated that the Governors could not buy any more land than the initial 100 acres led the Headmaster and Housemasters into some tortuous situations. Dr Haig Brown bought a plot on the Lammas Land for the boys' use and later duly conveyed it to the Governors (7/1/10). When in 1896 it was evident that it would be to the advantage of the School to buy the fields to the north, across Hurtmore Road, the Headmaster and five Assistant Masters made the purchase. This group was later the "Pavilion Committee", which bought Broom and Lees in 1906. No records kept by this Committee have come to light. Part of the

land was handed over to the Governing Body (a distinct charity since 1905) in 1923 (7/2/6).

Some Masters became so wrapped up in the life of the School that it is as difficult for us to separate their private lives and personal papers from School activities and records as it no doubt was for them. A H Tod compiled albums of the early life of the Corps, and these (which he apparently regarded as School records) are listed with the Corps' own registers, photos and files (88/14/1-2). Tod was a patron of schoolboy caricaturists, including Max Beerbohm, and apparently gave his album to the School (ACC 0413). Among his many other positions he was Secretary and Treasurer of the War Memorial Chapel Fund. He continued in this position after he retired from the School, and subsequently very properly sent Minute Books and other papers back. These have been left with ACC O numbers, since they had clearly been taken away and treated as personal papers (ACC 0110 and other numbers).

Many of the letters and papers amassed by R L Arrowsmith when Registrar, and preparing editions of the Register of OCs, would be part of the School's records if the Registrar had then been a School official, as is now the case. However Arrowsmith, like most of the earlier Registrars, was a volunteer and carried on after he had left the School. Intermingled in his papers concerned with the minutiae of Carthusian genealogy are the records of cricket clubs and of his life as a Housemaster at Lancing, as well as personal letters. Apart from a few items he handed on to subsequent Registrars (42/3) it has therefore seemed better to leave all the files that were deposited after his death as Accessions in the third group (ACC 1059 and 10251 and 10253).

The papers of Masters relating to their teaching and other School work also present a problem. By and large any papers that were already among School records by January 1990 were included in the section "Papers of Individual Masters" (62/ ), having evidently been handed over as belonging to the School. All the records, including those of music lessons and chapel services, that came from John Wilson are included in the section "Music School" (92/29), partly because they include the papers of Wilson's predecessor Fielden, and thus cover the musical life of the School from 1928-1964, and partly because, from an early period, the Music School has a marked and distinct identity. For this last reason the music of the OC Sir Walter Jenner has also been placed here (92/28/6). A recent addition are the pupils' registers (1956-1992) handed over by Geoffrey Ford when he left (92/29/2). Where, however, original music was given by composers not working in the School, such as Basil Harwood and Ralph Vaughan Williams, the items have been left as Accessions, but for convenience are listed in the Music School section.

Self-evidently in some cases what may seem an arbitrary decision has had to be made about where to list a document. There are also some guesses. Whether all the documents listed as belonging to Old Charterhouse (170/1) found their way from London to Godalming, or whether they were bought and given by generous OCs may never be possible to establish.

## FINDING AIDS

### 1. The Systematic List covers the FIRST GROUP

This typed list, preceded by Scheme and Summary, is not (as already mentioned) in itself a fully detailed list. It shows the arrangement of the records produced by the School (Group I) and provides an overview. The covering dates of surviving documents in each class are set out.

Further details of individual items are to be found in binders. Look under the number of the document or class you are interested in. For example, 47/1-93 is described in the typed list of "Files, Correspondence & Papers of Individual Headmasters" as "Robert Birley" with the covering dates 1935-1946. In the binder will be found the titles of each of the 93 files or individual letters. In many cases the material in these binders is the rough work for the typed list, but almost always there is more detailed information about the documents in this class in the binders than in the typed list.

### 2. The "Card Box" System on Computer covers the FIRST GROUP SECOND GROUP THIRD GROUP

Every item in all three groups of records is entered on the computer.

Each item can be called up individually, using either its number or one of the significant words or names in its description. A copy of the headings, or fields, on each "Card Box" card follows this section.

Because the computer does not like mixing words and numbers, items in the Second and Third Groups are best called up using their numbers alone (and omitting the ACC prefix): e.g. the card for ACC 0117, the MS of the Charterhouse Play "Bubble & Squeak", given in July 1935 by H L Gandell, can be called up by entering 0117. It can also be called up by entering Gandell, or Bubble & Squeak (or other words, or the month or year of the date). In both the latter cases not only this card will become available, but in the first all the cards with any reference to Gandell and in the second all the cards with any reference to Bubble & Squeak (always assuming that these words have been highlighted for indexing). If the date is used all other July entries or all other 1935 entries will appear.

In the same way Accessions in the Third Group can be called up entering only their 10 number, or a word or name.

Because not all the items in the First Group have been listed to the same depth on the computer, and because it is not possible to tell whether a section has been entered by piece or only as a section, and because the computer will only recognise the exact number, or set of numbers entered, it may be necessary to search by word rather than

number. For example, if the 93 individual items of Robert Birley's papers were each entered on a separate card, each could be called up in turn as 52/1, then 52/2, etc. If all are entered as 52/1-93, this would call up a general description. But if they were entered during the process of listing as, say 52/1-? the computer will not respond to any of the above alternatives, and recourse must be had to calling up "Birley" or "Headmaster" or "Correspondence", or even the dates concerned.

#### Additional Finding Aids for the **SECOND GROUP**

Because they are not amenable to arrangement in any systematic way and many are important, all the Accessions before 1990 have been listed in considerable detail on "Card Box". Numbers 01-01261 are also described, usually briefly, in a binder, where can in addition be found detailed lists of some deposits with higher numbers which are too lengthy to be fully described on a "Card Box" card, and are more conveniently scanned in a list. These include 0310 (French Resistance Papers, 2nd World War), 0322 (Sir Giles Gilbert Scott's correspondence files concerned with the building of the Memorial Chapel), 0324 (Scrap Book, W D Parrish), 0406 (Scrap Book), 0413 (Tod's Caricature Album), 0462 (Baden Powell entries from the Carthusian & Greyfriar), 0499 (French Revolutionary documents), and 0543 (Album of Drawings).

There is a rough alphabetical list of all depositors in this group in a binder. It gives only the date of deposit, and should be used with a series of cards in a box. These cards provide a brief description of all the ACC 0 deposits, with depositor's name, in sequential order of numbers, a sequence not otherwise available except on the computer, and there not uninterrupted. The series of cards was started in chronological order, but there are now mixed dates towards the end when older deposits which had come to light after the series was arranged had to be added.

#### A Note on the numbering of some items in the **THIRD GROUP**

Accessions since 1 January 1990 are entered in the Accession Register, and also on the computer. Where the accession is part of the School's own records and is included among them its number in the system as part of the First Group is also added to the entry in the Accession Register. Both numbers are (or should be) also entered on the computer's "Card Box" card.

#### Some General Remarks

The verbal indexing system of "Card Box" is very thorough, and it is hoped that it will be easy to find the description and whereabouts of any document, or of any (available) information which is sought for. The physical location of the storage of a document as given on the card was accurate when the card was made.



Apart from giving each card a number in the series of cards filled in (by which we know how many entries have been made, though this number cannot be used to call up a card), the computer is not interested in the sequence in which items are entered. To inspect what is entered on the cards for a sequence of documents, say 144/ to 148/ , entered in sequence, it is necessary to run through all the cards entered before 144/ . If you jump to 144/ , you cannot move straight on to the next card entered, but must start again and jump to 145/ .

Printed School Lists: "Blue Books" 1816 - 1939 36/1-103

From 1816-1818 these thin printed booklets with blue paper covers contain lists of Monitors, pupils by forms, prize subjects & texts. In 1819 the names of Governors, Masters and the School Captain are added, and this continues till 1830. 1833-1874 contain form lists & the text of the Examination of the Upper School, joined by Masters & Governors & Examiners in 1875. With variations, and occasional exceptional additions such as a note on the curriculum in 1920, a scheme of work in 1929 and details about admission and leaving in 1932, this format then remains standard, though the contents are always somewhat capricious. The Army Class is entered in a number of years from 1912-1924. No further Blue Books were produced after 1939.

## REGISTRAR (RECORDER)

*In this section are included records relating to pupils during their time at the School which are copies or compilations, and all records about past pupils, following them through life. Records of pupils while at the School and in later life are now both the responsibility of the Recorder, a member of the administrative staff of the School, working in the OC Office. In the past an OC, sometimes a member of Brooke Hall and sometimes not, kept the record of past pupils, collecting the information eventually published in the printed volumes of the Register.*

*Some of the early published compilations (such as that by Rev W D Parish) have been superseded by those which have added to them material collected in laborious and wide-ranging researches by many people, most notably R L Arrowsmith. These volumes (to which some additions are still being made in the Library's file copies) are the volumes covering the years 1769-1872, 1872-1900, 1900-1925, and 1925-1975.*

*The volume entitled **Alumni Carthusiani. A Record of the Foundation Scholars 1614-1769** was prepared by Bower Marsh and Arthur Crisp using work already done A H Tod, and with assistance from him and from G S Davies and H S Wright. It was privately printed in 1913. The work was thorough and this remains the standard work on the early Gownboys. The useful Introduction explains what sources they used.*
