The small collection of records catalogued in this volume relates to the alien priory of Beckford, co. Gloucester, and mainly to its Lincolnshire dependence of Colsterworth. Beckford was a cell to the abbey of Austin Canons of Ste Barbe en Auge, in Normandy. There is an account of it in the Victoria County History, Gloucestershire, vol. II, Religious Houses, p.102, an account which the present catalogue amplifies by the addition of two names, John de Haseyo (19) and Giles (20), to the list of priors there given.

The interest of Eton College in this property was short lived. 531:6s:8d rent from the manor of Bekforde, otherwise called the priory of Beckford, cos. Gloucester and Lincoln, to be paid through the hands of John Beauchamp, knight, tenant of the same, after the death of Robert Rees, knight, who held it for life, was included in the original endowment of the College of 25 March 1441. This grant was renewed 12 February 1444, (Calendar of Patent Rolls 1441-1446, p.243). On 8 January 1445 Robert Rees was granted rents elsewhere and surrendered the manor of Beckford to the Provost and College (Ibid: p.322), receiving a license to do so on 12 March following (Ibid: p.360). On 11 August 1462 Edward IV took away this rent from Eton and gave it to his college of Fotheringay, of which Thomas Bushall, his chaplain, was master. Unlike certain other of Henry VI's bequests to Eton, which Edward IV annulled, the manor of Beckford was never recovered by the Provost and remained with Fotheringay College until its dissolution, when it was granted by Edward VI to Sir Richard Lee..

The earliest of these deeds that can be precisely dated is no. 12. Hugh Le Peer, there mentioned as sheriff of Worcester, held that office in 1236. It is probable that most of the other undated deeds are not far off in date from this. William de Hingodeby, Canon of Salisbury, (no.9) appears in the

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Register of Hugh de Welles (i.e. before 1235), and Thomas de Sumerdeby (also no.9) appears in Lincolnshire Fines for 1233 and 1237 (Lincoln Final Concords 1187-1244, pp. 251, 296). Pagan the Clerk, a witness to no.9, was also witness to nos. 3, 7 and 8, and no.1 is linked to no.8 by Amfridus de Ultra Aqua. It is probable that nos.2 and 13, linked by Adam the Chaplain, are rather earlier in date, possibly of the reign of King John, as the evidence of the Seal tag of no.13 suggests.

No.1 is an interesting document. It is not an ordinary manumission. In fact it is not a manumission at all. Another deed was probably made by which Alan, son of Maurice, received his freedom from the hands of the Keeper of the house of St. Barbara. The present deed is the instrument which the liberator extracted from the liberated. It names and binds the guarantors ^{sixpence} for the promised yearly shilling by which Alan is buying his freedom, and it puts on record his promise to be obedient and docile. Madox's Formulare Anglicanum quotes several manumissions but gives no example of such a document as this. Why not? For the procedure illustrated by this deed would seem to be an obvious way of getting over the difficulty of the making of a contract between two parties to their mutual benefit where one party, being a serf, has nothing to give, has nothing in fact that does not belong to the other party. Heavy weather was made by Glanvill and Bracton (See Polleck and Maitland, History of English Law, vol. 1, pp. 427-8) over the legal inability of the serf to pay his lord for enfranchisement and the only way out was for a third party to be introduced who would buy the serf as with his own money (quasi propriis denariis) but actually with money lent him by the serf, whom he would free. The simple method of our deed does not appear to be mentioned by the legists, yet in spite of the mediaeval love of tortuous legal fictions, this method must surely have been a common one.

By it the serf gives all he can, a promise to pay, for the observance of which his guarantors are named. Though it is not suggested in the deed that the lord had any power of revoking his grant of freedom, there is a distinctly conditional tone about the document, which was the lord's quid pro quo. Alan, son of Maurice, was far from being scot-free.

The absence from Medox of a document of this kind argues rarity. It is easy to understand that deeds of manumission, made as they were for small people who would have no practical interest (or science) in keeping them after a generation or two, should not have survived in great numbers. But one wonders why deeds like no.1, made for the benefit of the manumitter, should not be fairly common among mediaeval collections of deeds whose archive history has been as happy as those at Eten. Yet this is the first I have come across.

No.1 is interesting also in that it may give evidence of the priory being in custody at the time. There is, however, nothing to bear this out in the Chancery Enrolments, and the word custos probably here means sub-prior or sacristan (Mediaeval Latin Word List).

Several deeds relate to Hecton (Hectun, Hegthon, Houcgon, Houghton, Houton, Octun) in Grantham (nos. 2-8, 14, 15; 19; 20) and one to Coleby a few miles south of Lincoln (no.18). Adam de Brom, grantor in the latter deed, was the founder of Oriel College Oxford, and both the messuage mentioned in this deed and the advowson of the church of Coleby passed to the College. Reference may be made to Oriel College Records, ed. C.L. Shadwell and H.E. Salter (Oxford Hist. Soc. vol. LXXXV, 1926), where it appears (p.485) that the prior's grant which preceded our deed is registered in the College's Registrum Munimentorum (Lansdowne MS. 386), and where there is a description of Adam de Brom's seal (p.85), identical with that on no.18, attached to a deed of 1526.

Neither Tanner nor Dugdale refer to the Gilbertine establishments in Grantham which are mentioned in these deeds viz. domes fratrum Hospitalis Linc' (no.7) and the house of St. Katherine outside Lincoln (no.15). The former presumably refers to the Gilbertine Hospital of the Holy Sepulchre which was associated with the Priory of St. Katherine. The house or houses mentioned here most likely refer to the same edifice.

The presence of houses of the order of Gilbert of Sempringham reminds us that we are in Lincolnshire and would any but a Lincolnshire document be dated, as is one of the Court Rolls (15 April 1536. no.22), Monday after the feast of St. Guthlac?

Some identification of places remains to be done, notably for nos.2, 9 and 16. And can those names still be found in Colsteworth which appeared in Henry I's original grant to the church of Ste Barbe en Auge (see confirmation by Edward II printed in full in Calendar of Charter Rolls vol. III 1300-1326 pp. 308-311) - the land of Basiria which was Roger the priest's , and the wood of Rahaia which had belonged to William the harp-player? The Easton referred to in nos.10-12 is most probably Ashton-under-Hill, co. Gloucester., which was coupled with Beckford in Henry I's grant. It conceivably refers to Easton in Stoke Rochford, co. Lincs, next to Colsterworth, but the grantors and witnesses all point the other way. Nos.10 and 11, on account of their seals, have been among the documents on exhibition in the College Library (nos. 46 and 47).

There is a document partly relating to Beckford, catalogued no.561 in Eton College Records vol.2 (Piddlehinton, etc.). It is described as follows:
