Introduction

The parsonage of Bloxham, co. Oxford, came to Eton College, with various other properties, by an exchange with the Crown dated 1 June 1547 (no.1). It had been part of the possessions of the dissolved monastery of Godstowe, and included lands and tithes in Milcombe, Newington, Milton and Barford. The deed of exchange bears the ^{signature and} Great Seal of Edward VI and the signatures and seals of the Lord Protector Somerset, Archbishop Cranmer and other notabilities. An interesting clause of this deed relates to the delivery into the Court of Augmentations of all deeds and evidences concerning the properties surrendered by the College. The Catalogues of Eton College Records show that not by any means all such documents were handed over. In fact, a search through the indexes of the 13,000 ancient deeds of the Court of Augmentations has brought to light only half a dozen isolated deeds relating to the places mentioned in the exchange. It seems clear that this provision of the deeds was never carried out. The counterpart of the Deed of Exchange itself (no.1) does, however, survive among the records of the Court of Augmentations.¹

When compared with many of the other series of estate records in the Eton collection, the series catalogued in the present volume begins in modern times. But if the Bloxham documents are not particularly ancient, they are not dull. They include the vivid and detailed record of two quarrels, one in the seventeenth and the other in the eighteenth century, the first strident with passion and ill-feeling, the second conducted with courteous and gentlemanly restraint.

In 1663 one Nicholas Page became vicar of Bloxham. During his incumbency the lessee of the rectory was John Cartwright, who was followed by Ursula Cartwright (his widow?). The vicar's stipend was a bare 20^l a year, and in assessing Page's behaviour

in 1683 it should not be forgotten that he had been living on this miserable pittance for twenty years. At the latter date he brought an action in the Exchequer against certain of the inhabitants, demanding from them the payment of mortuaries, and through several documents (167-177) it is possible to trace the course of his acrimonious dispute with his flock.

Mortuaries are described as follows in Tomlins' Law Dictionary (1620):-

Mortuary

A gift left by a man at his death to his parish church for the recompence of his personal tithes and offerings not duly paid in his lifetime.

There is no mortuary due by law, but by custom.

Mortuaries are in fact a sort of Ecclesiastical Heriots: being a customary gift claimed by and due to the minister in very many parishes on the death of his parishioners. They seem originally to have been like lay heriots, only a voluntary bequest to the church; being intended as a kind of expiation and amends to the clergy for the personal tithes and other ecclesiastical duties, which the laity in their lifetime might have neglected or forgotten to pay. For this purpose, after the lord's heriot or best good was taken out, the second best chattel was reserved to the church as a mortuary.

This variety of customs with regard to mortuaries giving frequently a handle to exactions on the one side and frauds or expensive litigations on the other, it was thought proper by stat. 21 Hen.8 c.6 to reduce them to some kind of certainty. A scale was fixed, the maximum payment being 10/-.

"Since this statute, whereby mortuaries are reduced to a certainty, and on which stands the law of mortuaries

to this day, an action of debt will lie upon the said statute in the Courts of Common Law for recovery of the sum due for a mortuary, being by custom as aforesaid, although before that statute they were recoverable only in the Spiritual Court: but as such actions have never been brought, it is said they are still recoverable in that Court only."

The case of Page of Bloxham, then, was unknown to Tomlins. Perhaps it was the only such action that there has ever been. The documents before us certainly seem to show that Page was unjustifiably raking up the past. His claim received no recognition. Only such a cantankerous and ill-disposed character would have thought of putting it forward. At least, that is what his adversaries would have us believe.

But so conflicting was the evidence brought before the Exchequer (nos.167-8) that the Court referred the matter to a local arbitrator, Ursula Cartwright, the impropiatrix of the parsonage (no.169). Her award was far from gratifying the vicar. Let him speak for himself in an (undated) "Short Account of my Case", sent to the bishop of Oxford (no.174):-

A Short Account of my Case

When I came first to y^e Vicaridge of Bloxham (wch is one of the greatest Townes in the County of Oxon, y^e Hundred Town, & an ancient Chantry)wch was 1663 after a full years vacancy, such was the meanness of y^e place, I was informed by many ancient people then living, yt amongst other vicaridge dues mortuaries were one, & they had been anciently paid before y^e warre, I thereupon demanded y^m accordingly of the Executors of several p^{rs}ons in our Town, who after some time taken to deliberate & advise were convinced (I suppose) yt twas my right, & paid y^m to me as such. This was paid upon my demand for 10 years together & more. Afterwards as the dissenting party gain'd ground, & y^r numbers increased by y^r frequent Conventicles, they began to deny the paym^t of y^m, telling me yt twas

only an Old Popish Custom, & own'd by none but the Popish Bpps & Clergy, nay many of y^m upon the same account, refused to pay me Tithes also & they knew I was yⁿ also engaged in a very expensive suit in *sc̃cio* with Mr. Dyde a neighbour minister, about some parting Tithes in y^e Hamlet of Milcom, a Chappel belonging to Bloxham, w^r tho I cast him at a Country Tryal, yet I had no considerable recompence allow'd me for my great expense; That suit disabled me to look after my mortueries till of late, wⁿ I began wth about 4 or 5 of them in ye Exchequer: Hereupon the whole dissenting party in the Town (being very numerous) entred into a Confederacy to oppose me, & rallied up many witnesses (such as y^mselves) to swear y^t they never heard of any mort: paid, & instanc't in several persons, some of whom never dyed worth one, as hath been since made appear. On the Contrary, we proved it up. oath, & as was thought sufficiently, as may appear in our Breviat. But when the Cause came to be pleaded in *sc̃cio* Mr. Williams & Sr. Francis Winnington moved earnestly for a Country Tryal, as necessarily previous to a Decree, not doubting but in these parts to find a jury y^t would do their work; wch the Lds Barrons foreseeing, & considering also the greatness of y^t Charge, & the smalness of my place did, as I suppose, in favour to the Church refer our business, by Consent, to Madam Cartwright as to a Country Tryal, to report her judgment of it; who, though at first she told me she was Convinc't by the quality of ye evidence, & several Circumstances that my Cause was good, yet afterwards would not be brought to Certify so much, or to make any report at all, though she had seen, & had also a transcript of the Record found in the L^d Bps Registry at Oxon, wch at first she look'd upon as y^t wch would carry ye Cause wth out any more dispute, as being Certified under the Hands of the most Eminent men, y^t were yⁿ Living in ye Town. Only her Ladship was pleased to propose, & y^e Barrons, to prevent farther trouble in so vexatious a suit,

did concur wth her, that 20^{li} was to be given me by the Town, & all things to come to an amicable Conclusion, & upon paym^t of y^s money, the Bill to be wthdrawn, at the beginning of ye next Term, The Counsel on both sides agreeing to it, & resting well satisfied with ye justness of it; But I since for certain understand, y^t ye Deft's not looking upon it to be Compulserie, but y^t they are left at it were at Liberty, will do little or nothing in it, so that merely for want of money to manage my suit, mortuaries will be wholly lost, & I must sit down about 50 or 60^{li} a loser by the suit, besides y^e very great trouble I have been at for this year & halfe last past.

This is the Account y^t was given to my L^d Bp Fell. The inclosed is a true copy of a Record taken out of the Registry at Oxon.

Against the vicar's complaint must be balanced Mrs. Cartwright's answer (no.177):-

She came, she says, in person to the village and heard the witnesses herself, and only two could be found to say mortuaries had been paid of old, and the clerk's wife went down on her knees and said she had before sworn falsely. Numerous witnesses testified on the other side. Some had paid mortuaries for fear the plaintiff should sue them, "he being a very passionate man". Mrs. Cartwright decided that she and the parish should appease the vicar with 20^l," not as a right but in order to friendship". This agreement she thought much in favour of the plaintiff and communicated it to the Exchequer Court which made an order 7 Feb. 1683-4 that the defendants pay 20^l," not as his due, the Court being satisfied noe mortuaries to be due, but as a gratuity and upon payment of the money the Plaintiff to move to have his bill dismiss". Mrs. Cartwright paid 5 guineas towards the 20^l "over and above

the expenses she had beene at in entertaineing the parish upon that account to perswade them to the said agreement to the value of 15 or 16 pounds which had it not beene out of the respect the parish had to the said Mrs. Cartwright they would never have been induced to consent unto and have often declared to that effect."

"And as for a dissenting faction Prevaileing in the Parish that foments this pretended unjust denyall of Mortuaries Mrs. Cartwright knows not but hath enquired and heares of noe dissenters except some Quakers in Bloxham but tis easy to Calumniate and to call any man that will not comply with anothers humor Faction^s but tis wished the Pl^ts interest were better with his Parish in generall for if there be a great prevaileing number of Dissenters ti's feared they will not decrease But Mrs. Cartwright desires not to recriminate or reflect upon the Pl^t upon any acco^t whatsoever onely she thinks she is very ungratefully dealt with by him who after she hath beene at this paines and expence in his service to have now this edition of trouble and to be represented an enemy to his interest an obstruc^ter of what is his right end of a party with those that Combine agst him as well as dissent from the Church; Things that as she hates see that they are unworthylie reflected and all this unkindly returned for her paines and expence Whereas had not the said Mrs. Cartwright interested herselfe in his Favour the Law must have tooke its Course the Pl^ts Bill would have beene dismiss and no blaime could have beene laid upon Mrs. Cartwright nor she any wayes concerned in the Suite This Mrs. Cartwright affirmes to the best of her remembrance to be true Representacon of the Case And submitts whither the greatest ill she had done in the matter hath not beene to herselfe in interesting herselfe with the Pl^ts concernes.

Two further documents are to be placed on the balance, one on Page's side, a letter from the warden of Wadham to the Provost of Eton pleading the hardship of the vicar's case (no.172), the other against him, an order of the Exchequer Court for the dismissal of his case (no.171).

It is impossible, from the records before us, to take either side with confidence. Neither Page nor his Parishioners seem to have been exactly amenable. The only person to show a spirit of compromise was Mrs. Cartwright, and she was made to suffer for it. Page saw to that. In the middle of this dispute he launched a frontal attack on Mrs. Cartwright over quite another matter. He informed her that she was liable to pay procurations on the rectory of Bloxham to the archdeacon of Oxford, and that her payments were seven years behind.

Philip Boucher, presumably her steward or lawyer, wrote to one of the bursars of Eton asking for advice (no.178). He enclosed, he says, two copies taken from the Bishop's Registry at Lincoln, one made for Page, purporting to prove Mrs. Cartwright's liability for procurations, the other made for Mrs. Cartwright, and differing from the foregoing. Now, these records include three extracts stated to be from the Register of Bishop Hugh de Welles (1209-1235) relating to Bloxham¹. One of these (no.179) is said to have been made by Robert Shipman, notary public on 6 May 1669, but looks like a later copy. Another (no.180) is attested by Robert Shipman, and Henry Goodwyn, notaries public, and dated 7 Sept. 1663. The third, undated, is attested by Richard(?) Sapcote (no.181). The second of these contains an addition to the effect - inter alia - that the abbess of Godstow, of whom Mrs. Ursula Cartright as proprietrix would be the successor, was liable for procurations.

The upshot of this dispute, as of the other, does not appear from the records of Eton, though the Provost and Fellows may be

supposed to have made some sort of pronouncement. Search in the episcopal records at Oxford might throw light on both cases.

Nor do we know, from these records, the Provost's dispensation in the gentlemen's disagreement of 1741-3 between the Rev. George Freeman, D.D. and Thomas Gabell, esquire, concerning six yards of grass in the meadows of Bloxham (nos.182-6). Have the Provost and Fellows no records of these semi-judicial decisions they had from time to time to make?

Tripartite Indenture of 1 June 1547 between the King, of the first part, Edward, duke of Somerset, Lord Protector, Thomas, archbishop of Canterbury, Sir William Pawlet, Lord Saint John, John, earl of Warwick, Sir John Russell, Lord Russell, Cuthbert, bishop of Durham, Sir Anthony Browne, Sir William Pagett, Sir Anthony Denny, Sir William Herbert, Sir Edward Mountague, Thomas Bromeley, Sir Edward North, Sir Edward Wotton and Nicholas Wotton, executors of the will of King Henry VIII, of the second part, and Robert, bishop of Carlisle and Provost of Eton, of the third part. On 28 December 1546 the Provost and College granted the King the manor of Clatford, co. Wilts; the manor of Milbornbeck, the messuage and farm called Milbornbeck in the parish of Bere, a messuage in Torneworth, the meadow called Holme in the parish of Holm, the manor of Lutton, the messuage called Lutton in the parish of Steple, the manor of Povington, the messuage called Povington in the parish of Tyneham, co. Dorset; the manor of Enston or Endeston with its appurtenances in Whitchurche and Henxstrige, co. Somerset; a messuage late in the tenure of Thomas Smyth alias Butler and then of John Carter in the parish of Dorney, a tenement in the tenure of John Freend in Lakend in the parish of Burnam, tenements in the tenure of John Slipher in Burneham aforesaid, a tenement in the tenure of John Collyns in Lakend in Burnam aforesaid, half an acre of arable in Beverist and half an acre of arable in Mosham and two roods in Otemershe in Burnam aforesaid, a messuage at the Weke in the parish of Eton late in the tenure of John Wenold and then of Robert Saddocke, and a messuage at the Weke late in the tenure of John Butler, a messuage called the Christopher late in the tenure of Harry Spencer in Eton, co. Bucks; two acres and a half of meadow lying at Gyogynes Pole, a close of pasture called Parsones Close containing an acre and a half in the tenure of the said Harry Spencer, a messuage late in the tenure of Robert Saddocke, a messuage in Underowe in the parish

of Newe Windesour late in the tenure of William Hall and a cottage in Datchet lane late in the tenure of Richard Coke, the said messuage and cottage with lands appurtaining being lately called Mr. Bostes landes, and the lands called Greneslandes and Romney meades, an acre and three roods of land in the tenure of Nicholas Momford alias Couper, and two closes lately purchased of Richard Fitzwaters and late in the tenure of Andrew Bereman and then of Robert Saddocke; to hold in fee simple upon promise of an adequate recompense to the grantors in lands and rents equal to the foregoing, which was not performed in the lifetime of the said King Henry VIII though the promise was confirmed by his last will and testament. The premises were of the yearly value of 73l : 0s : 10½d.

Now, in return for the delivery of all deeds and evidences relating to the premises to the chancellor of keeper of the records of the Court of Augmentations, and for 25l : 6s : 3d, bergain and sale by the King and the Lord Protector and his co-executors to the Provost and College of the parsonage and church of Thurlby, co. Lincoln, lately belonging to the priory of St. Michael nigh Stamford, co. Northampton, dissolved, and the parsonage and church of Moche Compton, co. 

Introduction

The rectory of Long Compton came into the possession of Eton College by a deed of exchange with the Crown dated 1 June 1547. Various other properties were included in this deed which has been catalogued as no.1 of Eton College Records Vol.14 (Bloxham). The parsonage and church of "Moche Compton" are described in this deed, as having lately been parcel of the possessions of Thomas Cromwell, late earl of Essex attainted of high treason. He cannot have held it long. It had formerly belonged to Walden Abbey, the surrender of which took place on 22 March 1538¹. and on 27 March following (date of the warrant) the manor of Compton and the rectory of Compton manor were granted inter alia to Sir Thomas Audeley, the Lord Chancellor. A copy of this Patent is to be found in the present volume (no.1). On 25 March 1539 Audeley exchanged Long Compton with the abbot and convent of St. John Baptist Colchester for lands in Essex. Before the end of that year the last abbot of Colchester had been beheaded. The Patent Rolls do not contain the grant of Long Compton to Cromwell, though in April 1540 he received various other properties that had belonged to Colchester Abbey². In July of that year he lost his own head.

Dugdale in The Antiquities of Warwickshire (1765) p.415 states that Sir Thomas Pope had a grant of the rectory of Compton in the reign of Philip and Mary. The Calendar of Patent Rolls³ shows merely under date 29 June 1558 an Inspeximus and Exemplification at the request of Thomas Pope of various instruments including Audeley's Patent of 1538.

The earliest of the College leases to survive is dated 1590 (no.3), but it refers to an earlier one of 1571. This earliest lease contains a condition I have not elsewhere met among College leases, namely that the tenant shall provide "one good seasonable boar to be delivered yearly within 14 days next before the feast of the Nativity" or else the money equivalent i.e. 26s:8d. This clause still appears in the lease of 1870 (no.70).

The College had some distinguished tenants at Long Compton. The present volume more than once takes us to the Dictionary of National Biography:— with Nathaniel Brent, the warden of Merton (nos.11-13); with John Greaves, the mathematician, who in 1634 witnessed this deed for his warden (no.12) and in 1645, as sub-warden, took the lead in presenting a petition to the King for the removal of Brent who had sided with the Parliament; with John Doughty, another fellow of Merton, who favoured the Royalists, but during their eclipse was given asylum by Nathaniel Brent in his house in Little Britain. At the Restoration this John Doughty became a canon of Westminster. He died in 1672. The records catalogued in this volume bear out one vivid sentence in Anthony a Wood's biographical notice¹. "He had lived," says Wood "to be twice a child." In the indenture of 17 February 1669 (no.14) where Doughty was to sign was written "John Doughty his merke." It is actually much more than a mark that the old dotard made. He wrote his initials quite respectably on this document, as on nos.15 and 18.

Is it possible to look at unexplored Warwickshire documents of the age¹ Shakespeare without a certain hope at the back of one's mind? This hope is not utterly frustrated by the present volume. The name of Shakespeare

has found its way into it twice, in connection with two applied seals, one appearing on letters of 1770 and 1774 from Jacob Hinde (91) and from his solicitor or agent Thomas Walker (94), the other, slightly ^{smaller} similar, on the counterpart of a lease of 1782 to Anne Hinde (30). On each of these seals there appears the head of a Jacobean gentleman who looks remarkably like Shakespeare. It would be interesting to know who it was who chose Shakespeare for his emblem, if it is Shakespeare. If it is not, who is it?

Indenture of agreement, 12 February 1617, between Sir William Compton, knight, Lord Compton, Sir Thomas Compton, knight, his brother, and Walter Pye and Robert Pye, esquires, on one part, and the Provost and College of Eton on the other. Whereas Lord Compton et al hold the manors of Long Compton (sometime Stanleyes) and Bull-ynes, and the Provost and College hold the rectory of Long Compton, and their lands are "confusedlie intermingled" one with the other and the latter or their farmers have the tithes of the said manors and neither party can make so great a benefit as otherwise they might, the following articles are agreed upon:-

(1) Lord Compton et al to have the 14 yard land of meadow, arable and pasture, belonging to the said manors and being the demesne thereof, with all tithes therefrom formerly belonging to the rectory, and all right of common in a close of pasture in the ground called the Coates and in a meadow called the Overend meadow, heretofore belonging to 4 yard land and parcel of the rectory. To hold in perpetuity.

(2) Lord Compton et al. to have 2 yard land of meadow arable and pasture to the site of the now held by Lord Compton by virtue of a lease made by Anthony Ingram, esquire, and Dorothy, his wife, unto one Hawkins To hold for the term yet unexpired of the said lease.

(3) The Provost and College to have one close of meadow or pasture called the Courte Close containing about 10 acres, abutting to the north upon a brook running to the mill, to the south on a lane called Berry lane leading from the town into the field, to the west on Home lane, and to the east on the west part of the churchyard of the parish church of Long Compton, together with two dovehouses

therein and the flights of pigeons and one old decayed barn or outhouse. To hold in perpetuity.

(4) The Provest and College to have two small hamms or closes of meadow, containing about 2 acres, parcel of the demesne of the manor of Long Compton, abutting to the south upon the said brook and to the north upon a highway that separates Homeclose and the said hamms. To hold for the term yet unexpired of the said lease.

(5) The Provest and College to enjoy, as the tenants of the Overend, commons upon all the lands allotted for commons to the said tenants in the South Field and in the Overend Blasse Pasture.

(6) The foregoing articles to be embodied in a decree in the Court of Chancery.
